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## Associations of "Sins" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">apologetic</a></b>	Offering or expressing apology. <i>She was very <b>apologetic</b> about the whole incident.</i>
<b><a href="#">atone</a></b>	Turn away from sin or do penitence. <i>A human sacrifice to <b>atone</b> for the sin.</i>
<b>atonement</b>	(in religious contexts) reparation or expiation for sin. <i>He submitted his resignation as an act of <b>atonement</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">commit</a></b>	Refer a parliamentary or legislative bill to a committee. <i>You guys would have had me <b>committed</b>.</i>
<b>compunction</b>	A feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed). <i>They used their tanks without <b>compunction</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">confession</a></b>	The religious body or Church sharing a confession of faith. <i>His words are a political <b>confession</b> of faith.</i>
<b>contrite</b>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>A <b>contrite</b> tone.</i>
<b>contrition</b>	The state of feeling remorseful and penitent. <i>Prayers of <b>contrition</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">convict</a></b>	A person who has been convicted of a criminal offense. <i>Two escaped <b>convicts</b> kidnapped them at gunpoint.</i>
<b>expiate</b>	Make amends for. <i><b>Expiate</b> one's sins.</i>
<b>extrajudicial</b>	Beyond the usual course of legal proceedings; legally unwarranted. <i>An <b>extrajudicial</b> offer does not carry the same penalty in expenses.</i>
<b>forgive</b>	Stop blaming or grant forgiveness. <i>You will have to <b>forgive</b> my suspicious mind.</i>
<b>guilty</b>	Justly chargeable with a particular fault or error. <i>He felt <b>guilty</b> about the way he had treated her.</i>

<b>indiscretion</b>	A petty misdeed. <i>Sexual <b>indiscretions</b>.</i>
<b><u>misdeed</u></b>	Improper or wicked or immoral behavior. <i>His past <b>misdeeds</b> were forgiven.</i>
<b>penance</b>	Impose a penance on. <i>He had done public <b>penance</b> for those hasty words.</i>
<b>penitence</b>	The action of feeling or showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong; repentance. <i>A public display of <b>penitence</b>.</i>
<b>penitent</b>	A person who repents for wrongdoing (a Roman Catholic may be admitted to penance under the direction of a confessor). <i>A <b>penitent</b> expression.</i>
<b>penitential</b>	Relating to or expressing penitence or penance. <i>Wrote a <b>penitential</b> letter apologizing for her hasty words.</i>
<b>regret</b>	Express with regret. <i>Any inconvenience to readers is <b>regretted</b>.</i>
<b>regretful</b>	Feeling or expressing regret or sorrow or a sense of loss over something done or undone. <i><b>Regretful</b> over mistakes she had made.</i>
<b><u>remorse</u></b>	Deep regret or guilt for a wrong committed. <i>They were filled with <b>remorse</b> and shame.</i>
<b>remorseful</b>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>The defendant was <b>remorseful</b> for what he had done.</i>
<b>repent</b>	Feel remorse for; feel sorry for; be contrite about. <i>The Padre urged his listeners to <b>repent</b>.</i>
<b><u>repentance</u></b>	The action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse. <i>Each person who turns to God in genuine <b>repentance</b> and faith will be saved.</i>
<b>repentant</b>	Expressing or feeling sincere regret and remorse; remorseful. <i>He is truly <b>repentant</b> for his incredible naivety and stupidity.</i>
<b>rue</b>	Sadness associated with some wrong done or some disappointment. <i>She might live to <b>rue</b> this impetuous decision.</i>
<b><u>rueful</u></b>	Expressing sorrow or regret, especially in a wry or humorous way. <i>She gave a <b>rueful</b> grin.</i>
<b><u>salvation</u></b>	Deliverance from sin and its consequences, believed by Christians to be brought about by faith in Christ. <i>The Christian gospel of <b>salvation</b> for all mankind.</i>

A person who transgresses against divine law by committing an immoral act or acts.
