Associations of "Sins" (30 Words)

apologetic	Offering or expressing apology. <i>She was very apologetic about the whole incident.</i>
atone	Turn away from sin or do penitence. <i>A human sacrifice to atone for the sin.</i>
atonement	(in religious contexts) reparation or expiation for sin. <i>He submitted his resignation as an act of atonement.</i>
commit	Refer a parliamentary or legislative bill to a committee. <i>You guys would have had me committed.</i>
compunction	A feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed). <i>They used their tanks without compunction.</i>
confession	The religious body or Church sharing a confession of faith. <i>His words are a political confession of faith.</i>
contrite	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>A contrite tone.</i>
contrition	The state of feeling remorseful and penitent. <i>Prayers of contrition.</i>
convict	A person who has been convicted of a criminal offense. <i>Two escaped convicts kidnapped them at gunpoint.</i>
expiate	Make amends for. <i>Expiate one's sins.</i>
extrajudicial	Beyond the usual course of legal proceedings; legally unwarranted. <i>An extrajudicial offer does not carry the same penalty in expenses.</i>
forgive	Stop blaming or grant forgiveness. <i>You will have to forgive my suspicious mind.</i>
guilty	Justly chargeable with a particular fault or error. <i>He felt guilty about the way he had treated her.</i>

indiscretion	A petty misdeed. <i>Sexual indiscretions.</i>
<u>misdeed</u>	Improper or wicked or immoral behavior. <i>His past misdeeds were forgiven.</i>
penance	Impose a penance on. <i>He had done public penance for those hasty words.</i>
penitence	The action of feeling or showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong; repentance. <i>A public display of penitence.</i>
penitent	A person who repents for wrongdoing (a Roman Catholic may be admitted to penance under the direction of a confessor). <i>A penitent expression.</i>
penitential	Relating to or expressing penitence or penance. <i>Wrote a penitential letter apologizing for her hasty words.</i>
regret	Express with regret. <i>Any inconvenience to readers is regretted.</i>
regretful	Feeling or expressing regret or sorrow or a sense of loss over something done or undone. <i>Regretful over mistakes she had made.</i>
<u>remorse</u>	Deep regret or guilt for a wrong committed. <i>They were filled with remorse and shame.</i>
remorseful	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>The defendant was remorseful for what he had done.</i>
repent	Feel remorse for; feel sorry for; be contrite about. <i>The Padre urged his listeners to repent.</i>
<u>repentance</u>	The action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse. <i>Each person who turns to God in genuine repentance and faith will be saved.</i>
repentant	Expressing or feeling sincere regret and remorse; remorseful. <i>He is truly repentant for his incredible naivety and stupidity.</i>
rue	Sadness associated with some wrong done or some disappointment. <i>She might live to rue this impetuous decision.</i>
<u>rueful</u>	Expressing sorrow or regret, especially in a wry or humorous way. <i>She gave a rueful grin.</i>
<u>salvation</u>	Deliverance from sin and its consequences, believed by Christians to be brought about by faith in Christ. <i>The Christian gospel of salvation for all mankind.</i>

sinner

A person who transgresses against divine law by committing an immoral act or acts.
