He downed his drink in one swallow.








Usage Examples of "Sip" as a noun

Sip as a Verb

Definitions of "Sip" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "sip" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Drink in sips.
- Drink (something) by taking small mouthfuls.





Synonyms of "Sip" as a verb (4 Words)

drink Drink excessive amounts of alcohol be an alcoholic.

This wine is really **drink**ing beautifully.

drink slowly Drink excessive amounts of alcohol; be an alcoholic.

Take a sample or samples of something for analysis.

The input signal must be sampled at twice its higher

The input signal must be **sample**d at twice its highest frequency.

Perceive by the sense of taste.

This **taste**s of nutmeg.
