Definitions of "Sip" as a noun

- *A small drink.*

Synonyms of "Sip" as a noun (6 Words)

- dram** A unit of apothecary weight equal to an eighth of an ounce or to 60 grains.
*A wee **dram** to ward off the winter chill.*
- drink** A social gathering at which alcoholic drinks are served.
*He heaved the outboard motor into the **drink**.*
- drop** An instance of falling or dropping.
*There was a **drop** in pressure in the pulmonary artery.*
- mouthful** A quantity of food or drink that fills or can be put in the mouth.
*Poliomyelitis is a bit of a **mouthful**.*
- nip** A small sharp bite or snip.
*A strong beak which can deliver a serious **nip**.*
- swallow** An act of swallowing something especially food or drink.
*He downed his drink in one **swallow**.*

- *She took a sip of the red wine.*



Sip as a Verb

Definitions of "Sip" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "sip" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Drink in sips.*
- *Drink (something) by taking small mouthfuls.*



Synonyms of "Sip" as a verb (4 Words)

- drink** Drink excessive amounts of alcohol be an alcoholic.
*This wine is really **drinking** beautifully.*
- drink slowly** Drink excessive amounts of alcohol; be an alcoholic.
- [sample](#) Take a sample or samples of something for analysis.
*The input signal must be **sampled** at twice its highest frequency.*
- taste** Perceive by the sense of taste.
*This **tastes** of nutmeg.*



Usage Examples of "Sip" as a verb

- *I sat sipping coffee.*
- *She was sipping her tea.*
- *She sipped at her tea.*



Associations of "Sip" (30 Words)

beer

An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops.
*He ordered a **beer**.*

beverage

(chiefly in commercial use) a drink other than water.
*May I take your **beverage** order.*

carouse

A noisy, lively drinking party.
*Corporate **carouses**.*

cocktail

An alcoholic drink consisting of a spirit or spirits mixed with other ingredients, such as fruit juice or cream.
*Financial pressure plus isolation can be a deadly **cocktail** for some people.*

coffee

A cup of coffee.
*He ordered a cup of **coffee**.*

drink

A social gathering at which alcoholic drinks are served.
*This wine is really **drinking** beautifully.*

gin	Separate the seeds from cotton with a cotton gin. <i>Gin game.</i>
gulp	An act of gulping food or drink. <i>He gulped for help after choking on a big piece of meat.</i>
guzzle	Drink greedily or as if with great thirst. <i>This car guzzles petrol.</i>
honey	Of something having the color of honey. <i>She s a little honey.</i>
imbibe	Take in liquids. <i>If one does not imbibe the culture one cannot succeed.</i>
juice	A drink made from fruit or vegetable juice. <i>Digestive juices.</i>
lemonade	A drink made from lemon juice and water sweetened with sugar. <i>A jug of lemonade.</i>
licensee	Someone to whom a license is granted.
liqueur	A chocolate with a liqueur filling. <i>An Italian almond flavoured liqueur.</i>
liquor	Water used in brewing. <i>Waste liquors.</i>
mead	United States anthropologist noted for her claims about adolescence and sexual behavior in Polynesian cultures (1901-1978). <i>The tavern stocks beer cider perry and mead.</i>
<u>melted</u>	Having become liquefied by heating. <i>Rivers filled to overflowing by melted snow.</i>
nip	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>The Queen s corgis always nip at her staff s ankles.</i>
potable	Safe to drink; drinkable. <i>There is no supply of potable water available.</i>
quaff	To swallow hurriedly or greedily or in one draught. <i>Porter is a dark malty quaff.</i>
<u>revelry</u>	Lively and noisy festivities, especially when these involve drinking a large amount of alcohol. <i>Sounds of revelry issued into the night.</i>
slurp	A loud sucking sound made while drinking or eating. <i>She slurped her coffee.</i>
<u>sober</u>	Make or become sober after drinking alcohol. <i>His expression became sober.</i>

sup A sip of liquid.
A **sup** of ale.

swallow Enclose or envelop completely as if by swallowing.
The Nazis **swallowed** the Baltic countries.

tea A tropical evergreen shrub or small tree extensively cultivated in e g China and Japan and India source of tea leaves.
I **teaed** with Professor Herron.

vino Wine, especially that which is cheap or of inferior quality.

wine Treat to wine.
A glass of elderflower **wine**.
