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Associations of "Sir" (30 Words)

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| adopt | Put into dramatic form. <i>They adopted the Jewish faith.</i> |
| alphabetically | In the order of the letters of the alphabet. <i>Books are now arranged alphabetically by author.</i> |
| cognomen | An extra personal name given to an ancient Roman citizen, functioning rather like a nickname and typically passed down from father to son, for example Marcus Tullius Cicero. |
| daddy | An informal term for a father; probably derived from baby talk. <i>The daddy of all potholes.</i> |
| dame | A woman. <i>A matronly dame presided at the table.</i> |
| dating | Use of chemical analysis to estimate the age of geological specimens. |
| daughter | A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>The heptathlete could become one of Yorkshire's most famous daughters.</i> |
| dear | A sweet or endearing person. <i>This cost him dear.</i> |
| descendants | All of the offspring of a given progenitor. |
| epithet | An epithet used as a term of abuse. <i>People jeered and hurled racial epithets.</i> |
| esquire | A polite title appended to a man's name when no other title is used, typically in the address of a letter or other documents. <i>The lord of the manor, Richard Bethell Esquire.</i> |
| father | Treat with the protective care associated with a father. <i>A culture which has fathered half the popular music in the world.</i> |
| female | Relating to women or the female gender. <i>A herd of female deer.</i> |

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| gentleman | Used as a courteous title for a male fellow member of the House of Commons or the House of Representatives. <i>He behaved throughout like a perfect gentleman.</i> |
| grandparent | A parent of one's father or mother; a grandmother or grandfather. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe's grandparents living nearby.</i> |
| <u>guy</u> | Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>The guys only doing it for some doll.</i> |
| homosexual | Someone who practices homosexuality having a sexual attraction to persons of the same sex. <i>Homosexual desire.</i> |
| laddie | A boy or young man (often as a form of address). <i>He's just a wee laddie.</i> |
| lady | A women's public toilet. <i>I spoke to the lady at the travel agency.</i> |
| ma'am | A woman of refinement. |
| madam | Used to address a woman at the start of a formal or business letter. <i>Can I help you madam.</i> |
| male | Of or denoting the sex that produces gametes especially spermatozoa with which a female may be fertilized or inseminated to produce offspring. <i>The valve has standard half inch threaded male ends.</i> |
| <u>masculine</u> | A masculine word or form. <i>The masculine rhyme of annoy enjoy.</i> |
| patronymic | A name derived from the name of a father or ancestor, e.g. Johnson, O'Brien, Ivanovich. <i>The patronymic naming of children.</i> |
| puissant | Having great power or influence. <i>He would become a puissant man.</i> |
| <u>senior</u> | A student in one of the higher forms of a senior school. <i>Senior citizens.</i> |
| surname | Give a surname to. <i>He changed his surname from Kaye to Kasmin.</i> |
| venerable | Profoundly honored. <i>A venerable sage with white hair and beard.</i> |
| <u>virile</u> | (of a male) capable of copulation. <i>A new and virile leadership.</i> |
| woman | A disrespectful form of address to a woman. <i>A drawing of a young woman.</i> |
