- *An area of ground on which a town, building, or monument is constructed.*
- *A website.*



## Synonyms of "Site" as a noun (17 Words)

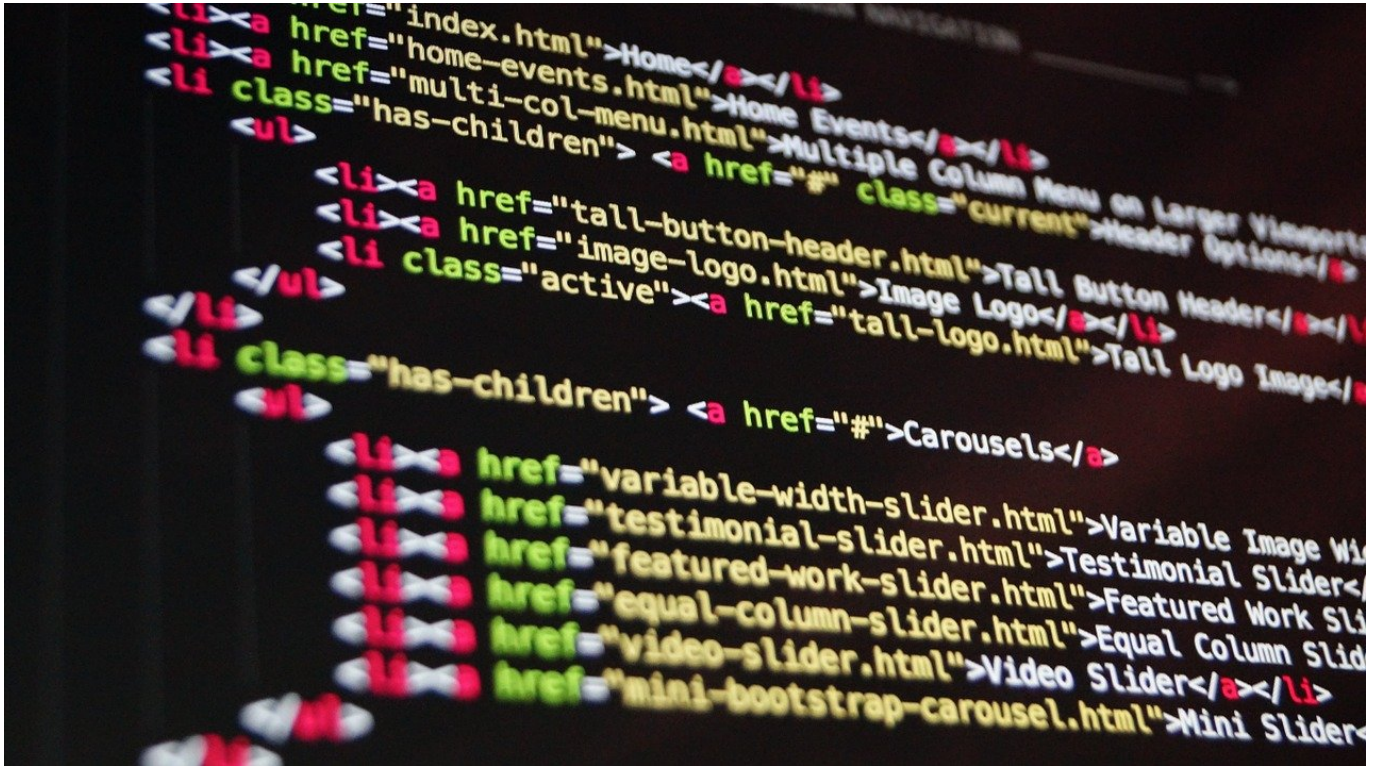
- area** A space allocated for a specific use.  
*The **area** steps.*
- internet site** A computer network consisting of a worldwide network of computer networks that use the TCP/IP network protocols to facilitate data transmission and exchange.
- land site** Material in the top layer of the surface of the earth in which plants can grow (especially with reference to its quality or use).
- locale** A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it.  
*Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic **locales**.*
- locality** An area or neighbourhood.  
*She had few friends in the **locality**.*
- location** A point or extent in space.  
*The movie was filmed entirely on **location**.*

<b>lot</b>	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>Schemes to improve the <b>lot</b> of the disadvantaged.</i>
<b>place</b>	The degree of priority given to something. <i>She put the book back in its <b>place</b>.</i>
<b>plot</b>	A small area of ground covered by specific vegetation. <i>There s a <b>plot</b> to overthrow the government.</i>
<b>position</b>	A proposition laid down or asserted a tenet or assertion. <i>The distress call had given the ship s <b>position</b>.</i>
<b>scene</b>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>The emergency team were among the first on the <b>scene</b>.</i>
<b>setting</b>	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A garnet in a heavy gold <b>setting</b>.</i>
<b>situation</b>	A set of circumstances in which one finds oneself; a state of affairs. <i>The present international <b>situation</b> is dangerous.</i>
<b>spot</b>	A job in an organization. <i>A <b>spot</b> of mildew on the wall.</i>
<b>web site</b>	An intricate trap that entangles or ensnares its victim.
<b>website</b>	A set of related web pages located under a single domain name, typically produced by a single person or organization. <i>For more information please visit our <b>website</b>.</i>
<b>whereabouts</b>	The place where someone or something is. <i>I questioned him about his <b>whereabouts</b> on the night of the crime.</i>

- place** Place somebody in a particular situation or location.

- position** Cause to be in an appropriate place, state, or relation.  
*A development plan which will **position** the city as a major economic force in the region.*
- put** Put into a certain place or abstract location.  
*They tried to **put** me at ease.*
- set** Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly.  
*Her features never **set** into a civil parade of attention.*

**situate** Put in context; describe the circumstances surrounding (something).  
*Amy is now comfortably **situated**.*

<a href="#">anywhere</a>	At or in or to any place anyplace is used informally for anywhere. <i>He couldn't be found <b>anywhere</b>.</i>
<b>at</b>	100 at equal 1 kip in Laos.
<a href="#">below</a>	See below. <i>I'll go <b>below</b> and fix us a drink.</i>
<b>berth</b>	Secure in or as if in a berth or dock. <i>The vessel had left its <b>berth</b>.</i>
<b>commodious</b>	Large and roomy ('convenient' is archaic in this sense). <i>They moved to a more <b>commodious</b> dwelling.</i>
<a href="#">corner</a>	Solid exterior angle of a building especially one formed by a cornerstone. <i>The southeastern <b>corner</b> of the Mediterranean.</i>
<b>courtyard</b>	An area wholly or partly surrounded by walls or buildings.
<b>everywhere</b>	All places or directions. <i>I've looked <b>everywhere</b>.</i>



<b>here</b>	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i><b>Here</b> is your opportunity.</i>
<b>hiding</b>	A severe defeat. <i>He went into <b>hiding</b>.</i>
<b>lieu</b>	The post or function properly or customarily occupied or served by another. <i>In <b>lieu</b> of.</i>
<b>locale</b>	A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it. <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic <b>locales</b>.</i>
<b>locate</b>	Take up residence and become established. <i>Engineers were working to <b>locate</b> the fault.</i>
<b>location</b>	A determination of the place where something is. <i>The <b>location</b> of new housing beyond the existing built up areas.</i>
<b>locus</b>	A particular position or place where something occurs or is situated. <i>The <b>locus</b> of points equidistant from a given point is a circle.</i>
<b>mall</b>	An alley used for pall mall. <i>They spent their weekends at the local <b>malls</b>.</i>
<b>park</b>	Maneuver a vehicle into a parking space. <i>Could I suggest we <b>park</b> that suggestion for the moment.</i>
<b>place</b>	Score a goal by a place kick. <i>A <b>place</b> of worship.</i>
<b>plaza</b>	Mercantile establishment consisting of a carefully landscaped complex of shops representing leading merchandisers; usually includes restaurants and a convenient parking area; a modern version of the traditional marketplace. <i>They bought fancy bridal wear at the <b>plaza</b>.</i>
<b>position</b>	The relative position or standing of things or especially persons in a society. <i>The company's financial <b>position</b> is grim.</i>
<b>put</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>The teacher <b>put</b> an interesting twist to the interpretation of the story.</i>
<b>roomy</b>	An associate who shares a room with you. <i>The cabin is <b>roomy</b> and well planned.</i>
<b>situate</b>	Situated. <i>A conveniently <b>situated</b> hotel.</i>
<b>situated</b>	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Nicely <b>situated</b> on a quiet riverbank.</i>
<b>somewhere</b>	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>It cost <b>somewhere</b> around two thousand dollars.</i>

- stance** The attitude of a person or organization towards something; a standpoint.  
*The party is changing its **stance** on Europe.*
- there** Used when gesturing to indicate the place intended.  
*Go **there** around noon.*
- treetop** The upper branches and leaves of a tree or other plant.
- venue** In law: the jurisdiction where a trial will be held.  
*The club is the city's main **venue** for live music.*
- wherever** In all places; regardless of where.  
*Meet me **wherever** you like.*
