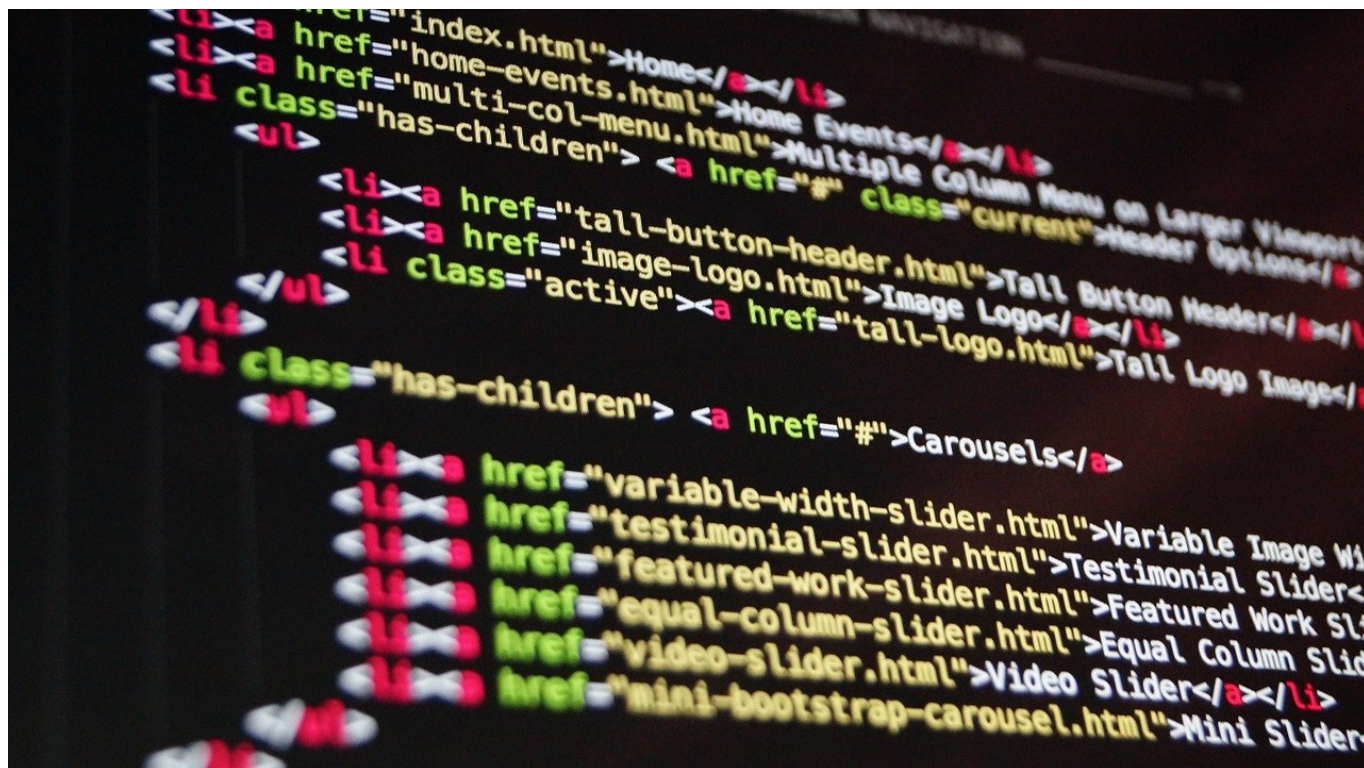
area	A space allocated for a specific use. <i>The area steps.</i>
internet site	A computer network consisting of a worldwide network of computer networks that use the TCP/IP network protocols to facilitate data transmission and exchange.
land site	Material in the top layer of the surface of the earth in which plants can grow (especially with reference to its quality or use).
locale	A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it. <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i>
locality	An area or neighbourhood. <i>She had few friends in the locality.</i>
location	A point or extent in space. <i>The movie was filmed entirely on location.</i>

lot	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>Schemes to improve the lot of the disadvantaged.</i>
place	The degree of priority given to something. <i>She put the book back in its place.</i>
plot	A small area of ground covered by specific vegetation. <i>There s a plot to overthrow the government.</i>
position	A proposition laid down or asserted a tenet or assertion. <i>The distress call had given the ship s position.</i>
scene	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>The emergency team were among the first on the scene.</i>
setting	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A garnet in a heavy gold setting.</i>
situation	A set of circumstances in which one finds oneself; a state of affairs. <i>The present international situation is dangerous.</i>
spot	A job in an organization. <i>A spot of mildew on the wall.</i>
web site	An intricate trap that entangles or ensnares its victim.
website	A set of related web pages located under a single domain name, typically produced by a single person or organization. <i>For more information please visit our website.</i>
whereabouts	The place where someone or something is. <i>I questioned him about his whereabouts on the night of the crime.</i>

- locate** Discover the exact place or position of.
*His marketing strategy has been to **locate** in small towns.*
- place** Place somebody in a particular situation or location.
*He won three times and **placed** three times.*
- position** Cause to be in an appropriate place, state, or relation.
*A development plan which will **position** the city as a major economic force in the region.*
- put** Put into a certain place or abstract location.
*They tried to **put** me at ease.*
- set** Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly.
*Her features never **set** into a civil parade of attention.*

situate Put in context; describe the circumstances surrounding (something).
*Amy is now comfortably **situated**.*

100 at equal 1 kip in Laos.

below

See below.
*I'll go **below** and fix us a drink.*

berth

Secure in or as if in a berth or dock.
*The vessel had left its **berth**.*

commodious

Large and roomy ('convenient' is archaic in this sense).
*They moved to a more **commodious** dwelling.*

corner

Solid exterior angle of a building especially one formed by a cornerstone.
*The southeastern **corner** of the Mediterranean.*

courtyard

An area wholly or partly surrounded by walls or buildings.

everywhere

All places or directions.
*I've looked **everywhere**.*

here	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i>Here is your opportunity.</i>
hiding	A severe defeat. <i>He went into hiding.</i>
lieu	The post or function properly or customarily occupied or served by another. <i>In lieu of.</i>
locale	A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it. <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i>
locate	Take up residence and become established. <i>Engineers were working to locate the fault.</i>
location	A determination of the place where something is. <i>The location of new housing beyond the existing built up areas.</i>
locus	A particular position or place where something occurs or is situated. <i>The locus of points equidistant from a given point is a circle.</i>
mall	An alley used for pall mall. <i>They spent their weekends at the local malls.</i>
park	Maneuver a vehicle into a parking space. <i>Could I suggest we park that suggestion for the moment.</i>
place	Score a goal by a place kick. <i>A place of worship.</i>
plaza	Mercantile establishment consisting of a carefully landscaped complex of shops representing leading merchandisers; usually includes restaurants and a convenient parking area; a modern version of the traditional marketplace. <i>They bought fancy bridal wear at the plaza.</i>
position	The relative position or standing of things or especially persons in a society. <i>The company's financial position is grim.</i>
put	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>The teacher put an interesting twist to the interpretation of the story.</i>
roomy	An associate who shares a room with you. <i>The cabin is roomy and well planned.</i>
situate	Situated. <i>A conveniently situated hotel.</i>
situated	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Nicely situated on a quiet riverbank.</i>
somewhere	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>It cost somewhere around two thousand dollars.</i>

stance

The attitude of a person or organization towards something; a standpoint.
*The party is changing its **stance** on Europe.*

there

Used when gesturing to indicate the place intended.
*Go **there** around noon.*

treetop

The upper branches and leaves of a tree or other plant.

venue

In law: the jurisdiction where a trial will be held.
*The club is the city's main **venue** for live music.*

wherever

In all places; regardless of where.
*Meet me **wherever** you like.*
