- *Physical position in relation to the surroundings.*
- *The piece of land on which something is located (or is to be located).*

- land site** United States inventor who incorporated Polaroid film into lenses and invented the one step photographic process (1909-1991).

- web site** A fabric (especially a fabric in the process of being woven).
- website** A computer connected to the internet that maintains a series of web pages on the World Wide Web.  
*I listened to the interview again on the BBC **website**.*

## Synonyms of "Sites" as a verb (2 Words)

- locate** Assign a location to.  
*His marketing strategy has been to **locate** in small towns.*
- place** Place somebody in a particular situation or location.  
*The company is well **placed** to seize the opportunity.*



## Associations of "Sites" (30 Words)

- anywhere** At or in or to any place anyplace is used informally for anywhere.  
*He could get **anywhere** from three to seven years.*
- at** 100 at equal 1 kip in Laos.
- below** See below.

- berth** Secure in or as if in a berth or dock.  
*They planned to **berth** HMS Impregnable at Portsmouth.*

- courtyard** An unroofed area that is completely or partially enclosed by walls or buildings, typically one forming part of a castle or large house.

<b>everywhere</b>	All places or directions. <i>I ve looked <b>everywhere</b>.</i>
<b>here</b>	Being here now. <i>Come <b>here</b> please.</i>
<b>hiding</b>	A severe defeat. <i>They caught him and gave him a <b>hiding</b>.</i>
<b>lieu</b>	The post or function properly or customarily occupied or served by another. <i>In <b>lieu</b> of.</i>
<b>locale</b>	The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic <b>locales</b>.</i>
<b>locate</b>	Take up residence and become established. <i>Engineers were working to <b>locate</b> the fault.</i>
<b>location</b>	An area where black South Africans were obliged by apartheid laws to live, usually on the outskirts of a town or city. The term was later replaced by township. <i>The movie was filmed entirely on <b>location</b>.</i>
<b>locus</b>	The set of all points or lines that satisfy or are determined by specific conditions. <i>A parabola is the <b>locus</b> of a point that moves so as to be equidistant from a fixed point and a straight line.</i>
<b>mall</b>	An alley used for pall mall. <i>They spent their weekends at the local <b>malls</b>.</i>
<b>park</b>	A lot where cars are parked. <i>There are laws that protect the wildlife in this <b>park</b>.</i>
<b>place</b>	Identify the location or place of. <i>He won three times and <b>placed</b> three times.</i>
<b>plaza</b>	Mercantile establishment consisting of a carefully landscaped complex of shops representing leading merchandisers; usually includes restaurants and a convenient parking area; a modern version of the traditional marketplace. <i>The <b>plaza</b> is lively in the evenings when the pavement cafes are full.</i>
<b>position</b>	The relative position or standing of things or especially persons in a society. <i>He moved himself into a reclining <b>position</b>.</i>
<b>put</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>He <b>put</b> her to the torture.</i>
<b>roomy</b>	An associate who shares a room with you. <i>A <b>roomy</b> but sparsely furnished apartment.</i>

<b>situate</b>	Situated. <i>It is necessary to <b>situate</b> these ideas in the wider context of the class structure.</i>
<b>situated</b>	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Nicely <b>situated</b> on a quiet riverbank.</i>
<b>somewhere</b>	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>Can we go <b>somewhere</b> warm.</i>
<b>stance</b>	Standing posture. <i>The party is changing its <b>stance</b> on Europe.</i>
<b>there</b>	To or toward that place; away from the speaker. <i><b>There</b> goes the phone.</i>
<b>treetop</b>	The upper branches and leaves of a tree or other plant.
<b>venue</b>	In law: the jurisdiction where a trial will be held. <i>The club is the city's main <b>venue</b> for live music.</i>
<b>wherever</b>	In or to whatever place (emphasizing a lack of restriction). <i>Meet me <b>wherever</b> you like.</i>
