- *The piece of land on which something is located (or is to be located).*

- internet site** A computer network consisting of a worldwide network of computer networks that use the TCP/IP network protocols to facilitate data transmission and exchange.
- land site** United States inventor who incorporated Polaroid film into lenses and invented the one step photographic process (1909-1991).
- situation** A job in an organization.

- web site** A fabric (especially a fabric in the process of being woven).
- website** A computer connected to the internet that maintains a series of web pages on the World Wide Web.
*I listened to the interview again on the BBC **website**.*

- *Assign a location to.*



Synonyms of "Sites" as a verb (2 Words)

- locate** Assign a location to.
*His marketing strategy has been to **locate** in small towns.*
- place** Place somebody in a particular situation or location.
*The company is well **placed** to seize the opportunity.*

- anywhere** At or in or to any place anyplace is used informally for anywhere.
*He could get **anywhere** from three to seven years.*

everywhere	All places or directions. <i>I've looked everywhere.</i>
here	Being here now. <i>Come here please.</i>
hiding	A severe defeat. <i>They caught him and gave him a hiding.</i>
lieu	The post or function properly or customarily occupied or served by another. <i>In lieu of.</i>
locale	The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i>
locate	Take up residence and become established. <i>Engineers were working to locate the fault.</i>
location	An area where black South Africans were obliged by apartheid laws to live, usually on the outskirts of a town or city. The term was later replaced by township. <i>The movie was filmed entirely on location.</i>
locus	The set of all points or lines that satisfy or are determined by specific conditions. <i>A parabola is the locus of a point that moves so as to be equidistant from a fixed point and a straight line.</i>
mall	An alley used for pall mall. <i>They spent their weekends at the local malls.</i>
park	A lot where cars are parked. <i>There are laws that protect the wildlife in this park.</i>
place	Identify the location or place of. <i>He won three times and placed three times.</i>
plaza	Mercantile establishment consisting of a carefully landscaped complex of shops representing leading merchandisers; usually includes restaurants and a convenient parking area; a modern version of the traditional marketplace. <i>The plaza is lively in the evenings when the pavement cafes are full.</i>
position	The relative position or standing of things or especially persons in a society. <i>He moved himself into a reclining position.</i>
put	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>He put her to the torture.</i>
roomy	An associate who shares a room with you. <i>A roomy but sparsely furnished apartment.</i>

situate	Situated. <i>It is necessary to situate these ideas in the wider context of the class structure.</i>
situated	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Nicely situated on a quiet riverbank.</i>
somewhere	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>Can we go somewhere warm.</i>
stance	Standing posture. <i>The party is changing its stance on Europe.</i>
there	To or toward that place; away from the speaker. <i>There goes the phone.</i>
treetop	The upper branches and leaves of a tree or other plant.
venue	In law: the jurisdiction where a trial will be held. <i>The club is the city's main venue for live music.</i>
wherever	In or to whatever place (emphasizing a lack of restriction). <i>Meet me wherever you like.</i>
