<b>enough</b>	An adequate quantity a quantity that is large enough to achieve a purpose. <i>I can get there easily <b>enough</b>.</i>
<b>exceeding</b>	Extremely exceedingly. <i>She spoke warmly of his <b>exceeding</b> kindness.</i>
<b>hefty</b>	Of considerable weight and size. <i>A <b>hefty</b> young chap.</i>
<b>large</b>	A garment size for a large person. <i>A <b>large</b> number of newspapers.</i>
<b>lot</b>	The choice resulting from deciding something by lot. <i>I feel a whole <b>lot</b> better.</i>
<b>massive</b>	Being the same substance throughout. <i>The Bristol <b>massive</b>.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Affording an abundant supply. <i>Food is <b>plentiful</b>.</i>
<b>ponderable</b>	Capable of being weighed or considered. <i>Something <b>ponderable</b> from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>The young Mozart s <b>prodigious</b> talents.</i>
<b>profundity</b>	The intellectual ability to penetrate deeply into ideas. <i>The <b>profundity</b> of her misery.</i>
<b>significant</b>	Fairly large. <i>A <b>significant</b> silence.</i>
<b>spacious</b>	Having ample space. <i>A <b>spacious</b> ballroom.</i>
<b>substantial</b>	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary. <i>A mere dream neither <b>substantial</b> nor practical.</i>
<b>sufficiency</b>	Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>He questioned the <b>sufficiency</b> of human intelligence.</i>
<b>sufficient</b>	Enough; adequate. <i>We have <b>sufficient</b> reason for supposing this to be the case.</i>
<b>sufficiently</b>	To a sufficient degree. <i>He recovered <b>sufficiently</b> to resume his duties.</i>
<b>tome</b>	A book, especially a large, heavy, scholarly one. <i>A weighty <b>tome</b>.</i>
