goodly	Large in amount or extent or degree. <i>A goodly number of our countrymen.</i>
healthy	In a good physical or mental condition; in good health. <i>Staying fit and healthy.</i>
hefty	Large in amount or extent or degree. <i>He aimed a hefty kick at the door.</i>

respectable	Regarded by society to be good, proper, or correct. <i>All respectable companies give guarantees.</i>
sizeable	Large in amount or extent or degree. <i>A sizeable proportion of the population.</i>
tidy	Of hair neat and tidy. <i>A tidy house.</i>

abundantly	In an abundant manner. <i>My boss made it abundantly clear that if I didn't like it I should look for another job.</i>
adequacy	The quality of being sufficient for the end in view. <i>He questioned the adequacy of the usual sentimental interpretation of the Golden Rule.</i>
adequate	Sufficient for the purpose. <i>An adequate income.</i>
adequately	To a satisfactory or acceptable extent. <i>The resources required to prepare adequately will be extensive.</i>
ample	Fairly large in size. <i>An ample supply of consumer goods.</i>
appreciable	Large or important enough to be noticed. <i>Pupils may have to travel appreciable distances.</i>
bountiful	Producing in abundance. <i>This bountiful God has thought of everything.</i>
considerable	Large or relatively large in number or amount or extent or degree. <i>The economy was a considerable issue in the campaign.</i>
copious	Profuse in speech or ideas. <i>I had been a little too copious in talking of my country.</i>
copiously	In an expansive or wide-ranging way. <i>I was drinking copiously.</i>
enormity	Vastness of size or extent. <i>A thorough search disclosed the full enormity of the crime.</i>

enough	An adequate quantity a quantity that is large enough to achieve a purpose. <i>I can get there easily enough.</i>
exceeding	Extremely exceedingly. <i>She spoke warmly of his exceeding kindness.</i>
hefty	Of considerable weight and size. <i>A hefty young chap.</i>
large	A garment size for a large person. <i>A large number of newspapers.</i>
lot	The choice resulting from deciding something by lot. <i>I feel a whole lot better.</i>
massive	Being the same substance throughout. <i>The Bristol massive.</i>
plentiful	Affording an abundant supply. <i>Food is plentiful.</i>
ponderable	Capable of being weighed or considered. <i>Something ponderable from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
prodigious	Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>The young Mozart s prodigious talents.</i>
profundity	The intellectual ability to penetrate deeply into ideas. <i>The profundity of her misery.</i>
significant	Fairly large. <i>A significant silence.</i>
spacious	Having ample space. <i>A spacious ballroom.</i>
substantial	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary. <i>A mere dream neither substantial nor practical.</i>
sufficiency	Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>He questioned the sufficiency of human intelligence.</i>
sufficient	Enough; adequate. <i>We have sufficient reason for supposing this to be the case.</i>
sufficiently	To a sufficient degree. <i>He recovered sufficiently to resume his duties.</i>
tome	A book, especially a large, heavy, scholarly one. <i>A weighty tome.</i>

vast Of very great extent or quantity; immense.
*A **vast** plain full of orchards.*

voluminous (of writing) very lengthy and detailed.
*We all scribbled down **voluminous** notes.*
