- Giving only major points; lacking completeness.






Synonyms of "Sketchy" as an adjective (13 Words)

bitty	Tiny. A little bitty girl.	
fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Fragmentary remains</i> .	
<u>inadequate</u>	Not sufficient to meet a need. <i>Inadequate funding</i> .	
incomplete	Not having all the necessary or appropriate parts. <i>An</i> incomplete account of his life.	
<u>insufficient</u>	Not enough; inadequate. There was insufficient evidence to convict him.	
lacking in detail Nonexistent.		



limited	Denoting a limited company used after a company name. The party stands for individual freedom and limited government.
patchy	Existing or happening in small, isolated areas. A patchy essay.
perfunctory	As a formality only. Perfunctory courtesy.
<u>rudimentary</u>	Relating to an immature, undeveloped, or basic form. <i>Rudimentary</i> wings.
scrappy	Full of fighting spirit. A scrappy admiral.
<u>superficial</u>	Hasty and without attention to detail; not thorough. A superficial mind.
unelaborated	Giving only major points; lacking completeness. The theory remains unelaborated and sketchy.






Usage Examples of "Sketchy" as an adjective

alliterate

Use words beginning with the same sound or letter. *His first and last names alliterated.*



<u>approximate</u>	Not quite exact or correct. The approximate time was 10 o clock.
approximative	Not quite exact or correct. A crudely approximative outline.
craggy	(of a cliff or rock face) rough and uneven. A craggy coastline.
<u>crude</u>	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. A crude cabin of logs with bark still on them.
dicey	Of uncertain outcome; especially fraught with risk- New Yorker. An extremely dicey future on a brave new world of liquid nitrogen tar and smog.
dozen	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one. She has dozen s of admirers.
draft	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. Draft a speech.
fractional	Relating to or denoting the separation of a mixture into fractions. There was a fractional hesitation before he said yes.
fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.
<u>half</u>	A half price fare or ticket especially for a child. <i>Divide the cake in half.</i>
<u>incomplete</u>	Not having all the necessary or appropriate parts. An incomplete account of his life.
jagged	Having a sharply uneven surface or outline. <i>Her jagged nerves.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e g least shrew. <i>He has the least talent of anyone.</i>
moiety	A distinct part of a large molecule. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate moiety.</i>
<u>nearly</u>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. In the absence of anyone more nearly related I was designated next of kin.
part	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one s duty. <i>The city is now part slum part consumer paradise.</i>
<u>partial</u>	Favouring one side in a dispute above the other; biased. A question to which we have only partial answers.



pendent	An adornment that hangs from a piece of jewelry (necklace or earring. <i>Pendent</i> catkins.
pending	Awaiting decision or settlement. <i>Business still pending.</i>
<u>portion</u>	A part of something divided between two or more people; a share. <i>Burger joints offering huge portions.</i>
raw	(of the edge of a piece of cloth) not having a hem or selvedge. <i>Raw</i> beauty.
rough	Work or shape something in a rough preliminary fashion. The nomad life is rough and hazardous.
<u>rugged</u>	Having attractively strong, rough-hewn features (typically used of a man. A rugged coastline.
serrated	Having or denoting a jagged edge; sawlike. A knife with a serrated edge.
toothed	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Saw toothed</i> .
twelve	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one.
<u>uneven</u>	Variable and recurring at irregular intervals. <i>Uneven</i> spacing.
unfinished	Not brought to an end or conclusion. The building is still unfinished .
unsafe	Not safe from attack. Drinking water in some areas may be unsafe .
