Synonyms of "Sketchy" as an adjective (13 Words)

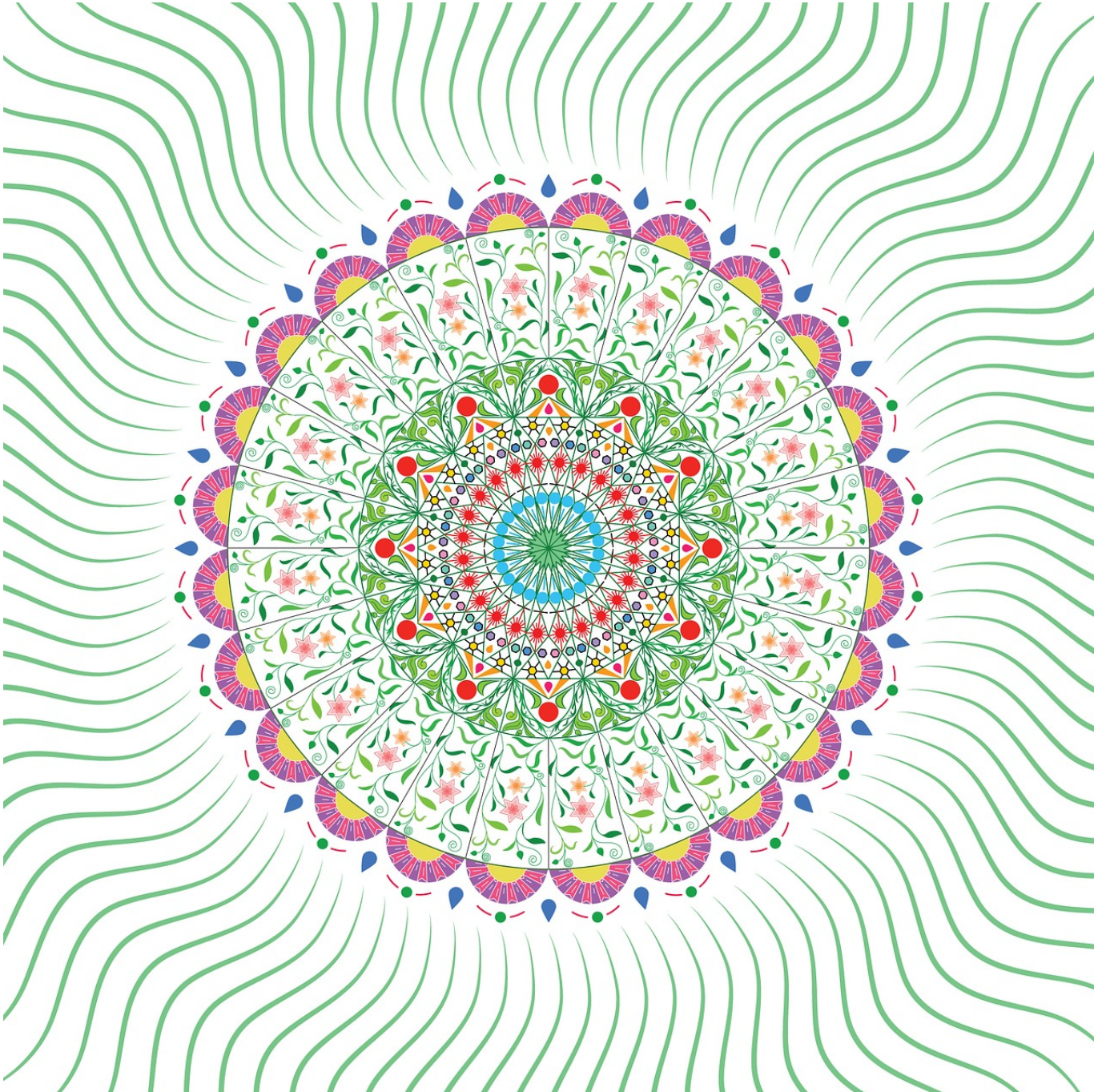
bitty	Tiny. <i>A little bitty girl.</i>
fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Fragmentary remains.</i>
<u>inadequate</u>	Not sufficient to meet a need. <i>Inadequate funding.</i>
<u>incomplete</u>	Not having all the necessary or appropriate parts. <i>An incomplete account of his life.</i>
<u>insufficient</u>	Not enough; inadequate. <i>There was insufficient evidence to convict him.</i>
lacking in detail	Nonexistent.

limited	Denoting a limited company used after a company name. <i>The party stands for individual freedom and limited government.</i>
patchy	Existing or happening in small, isolated areas. <i>A patchy essay.</i>
perfunctory	As a formality only. <i>Perfunctory courtesy.</i>
rudimentary	Relating to an immature, undeveloped, or basic form. <i>Rudimentary wings.</i>
scrappy	Full of fighting spirit. <i>A scrappy admiral.</i>
superficial	Hasty and without attention to detail; not thorough. <i>A superficial mind.</i>
unelaborated	Giving only major points; lacking completeness. <i>The theory remains unelaborated and sketchy.</i>

alliterate

Use words beginning with the same sound or letter.
*His first and last names **alliterated**.*

approximate	Not quite exact or correct. <i>The approximate time was 10 o'clock.</i>
approximative	Not quite exact or correct. <i>A crudely approximative outline.</i>
craggy	(of a cliff or rock face) rough and uneven. <i>A craggy coastline.</i>
crude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>A crude cabin of logs with bark still on them.</i>
dicey	Of uncertain outcome; especially fraught with risk- New Yorker. <i>An extremely dicey future on a brave new world of liquid nitrogen tar and smog.</i>
dozen	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one. <i>She has dozens of admirers.</i>
draft	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. <i>Draft a speech.</i>
fractional	Relating to or denoting the separation of a mixture into fractions. <i>There was a fractional hesitation before he said yes.</i>
fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.</i>
half	A half price fare or ticket especially for a child. <i>Divide the cake in half.</i>
incomplete	Not having all the necessary or appropriate parts. <i>An incomplete account of his life.</i>
jagged	Having a sharply uneven surface or outline. <i>Her jagged nerves.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>He has the least talent of anyone.</i>
moiety	A distinct part of a large molecule. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate moiety.</i>
nearly	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>In the absence of anyone more nearly related I was designated next of kin.</i>
part	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one's duty. <i>The city is now part slum part consumer paradise.</i>
partial	Favouring one side in a dispute above the other; biased. <i>A question to which we have only partial answers.</i>

pendent	An adornment that hangs from a piece of jewelry (necklace or earring). <i>Pendent catkins.</i>
pending	Awaiting decision or settlement. <i>Business still pending.</i>
<u>portion</u>	A part of something divided between two or more people; a share. <i>Burger joints offering huge portions.</i>
raw	(of the edge of a piece of cloth) not having a hem or selvedge. <i>Raw beauty.</i>
rough	Work or shape something in a rough preliminary fashion. <i>The nomad life is rough and hazardous.</i>
<u>rugged</u>	Having attractively strong, rough-hewn features (typically used of a man). <i>A rugged coastline.</i>
serrated	Having or denoting a jagged edge; sawlike. <i>A knife with a serrated edge.</i>
toothed	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Saw toothed.</i>
twelve	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one.
<u>uneven</u>	Variable and recurring at irregular intervals. <i>Uneven spacing.</i>
unfinished	Not brought to an end or conclusion. <i>The building is still unfinished.</i>
unsafe	Not safe from attack. <i>Drinking water in some areas may be unsafe.</i>
