Synonyms of "Skewed" as an adjective (1 Word)

skew Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. A **skew** angle.





Associations of "Skewed" (30 Words)

<u>angle</u>	Move or be inclined at an angle. <i>He angled his way into the room.</i>
<u>askew</u>	Wrong; awry. The plan went sadly askew .
asymmetric	Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.
asymmetrical	Having parts that fail to correspond to one another in shape, size, or arrangement; lacking symmetry. <i>Asymmetrical features.</i>
<u>awry</u>	Turned or twisted to one side. I got the impression that something was awry .
bend	Bend one s back forward from the waist on down. A bend in the river.



<u>bent</u>	Used of the back and knees; stooped. <i>He had a bent for it.</i>
crimp	A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together. <i>Pliers will crimp wires together.</i>
<u>crooked</u>	Bent or twisted out of shape or out of place. <i>Crooked teeth</i> .
<u>curve</u>	Form an arch or curve. The vehicle rounded a curve .
<u>deviate</u>	A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior. <i>Those who</i> deviate from society s values.
flex	The action or state of flexing. <i>Flex</i> a muscle.
<u>fold</u>	An angular or rounded shape made by folding. The club fold ed earlier this year.
garble	A garbled account or transmission. Upon winning a race a driver spews out a litany of commercial garble .
<u>irregular</u>	A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by sabotage and harassment. <i>His strong irregular features.</i>
kink	Form a curl curve or kink. The river kink s violently in a right angle.
<u>lean</u>	Cause to lean to the side. A lean budget.
lopsided	With one side lower or smaller than the other. A lopsided grin.
oblique	An oblique muscle. Acute and obtuse angles are oblique angles.
sideways	(of movement) at an angle. <i>Leaning sideways.</i>
<u>slew</u>	Of an electronic device undergo slewing. I was assaulted by the thump and slew of the van.
stoop	Lower one's moral standards so far as to do something reprehensible. I won t stoop to reading other people s mail.
swerve	Divergence from a straight course imparted to a ball or other object, especially in soccer, cricket, or snooker. Do not make sudden swerve s particularly around parked vehicles.



turn	Turning or twisting around in place. <i>He turned traitor.</i>
<u>twist</u>	A fine strong thread consisting of twisted strands of cotton or silk. It was soon time for the next twist of fate in his extraordinary career.
unequal	A person or thing regarded as unequal to another in status or level. <i>Two rooms of unequal size</i> .
<u>uneven</u>	Not level or smooth. Vaudeville waged an uneven battle against the church.
warp	In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth. <i>Wood has a tendency to warp.</i>
winding	The act of winding or twisting. A winding country road.
wry	Bent to one side. With a wry Scottish wit.
