- *(especially in jazz) a drum or drum head.*

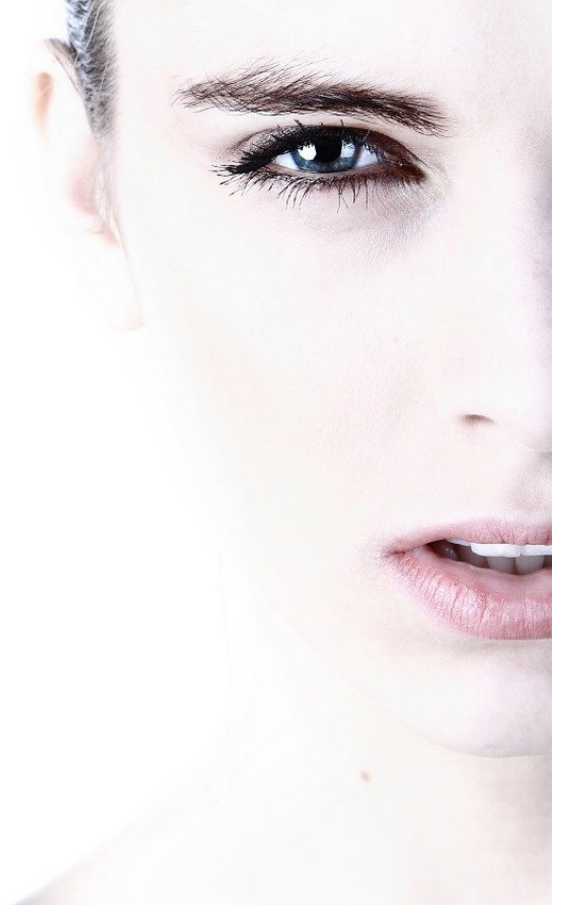


Synonyms of "Skin" as a noun (29 Words)

baldhead	(among Rastafarians) a person who is not a Rastafarian.
baldpate	A person whose head is bald or shaved.
baldy	A bald-headed person.
casing	A cover or shell that protects or encloses something. <i>A waterproof casing.</i>
coat	A single application of paint or similar material on a surface. <i>A winter coat.</i>
coating	A decorative texture or appearance of a surface (or the substance that gives it that appearance). <i>The surface was ready for a coating of paint.</i>
colouring	The characteristic of quarks that determines their role in the strong interaction. <i>Food colouring.</i>

complexion	The coloring of a person's face. <i>A smooth pale complexion.</i>
cover	An area of the field consisting of cover point and extra cover. <i>The cover concealed their guns from enemy aircraft.</i>
covering	The act of protecting something by covering it. <i>A vinyl floor covering.</i>
cutis	The true skin or dermis.
dermis	The thick layer of living tissue below the epidermis which forms the true skin containing blood capillaries nerve endings sweat glands hair follicles and other structures.
epidermis	The surface epithelium of the skin, overlying the dermis.
<u>exterior</u>	The outer side or surface of something. <i>An ideal spot to film exteriors.</i>
film	A thin sheet of (usually plastic and usually transparent) material used to wrap or cover things. <i>He had already shot a whole roll of film.</i>
fleece	A jacket or other garment made from a fleece fabric. <i>He clutched the ram by two handfuls of thick fleece.</i>
hide	The dressed skin of an animal (especially a large animal).
<u>layer</u>	A shoot fastened down to take root while attached to the parent plant. <i>They can be increased from cuttings and layers.</i>
<u>outside</u>	The region that is outside of something. <i>Record the date on the outside of the file.</i>
overlay	A block of code or other data transferred during the overlay process. <i>Full colour aerial photographs with overlays showing suggested routes.</i>
peel	The rind of a fruit or vegetable. <i>Pieces of potato peel.</i>
pelt	An act of hurling something at someone.
pigmentation	The deposition of pigment in animals or plants or human beings.
pod	A narrow-necked purse net for catching eels. <i>Gorse pods were popping in the sun.</i>
rind	The bark of a tree or plant. <i>Olive oil infused with lemon rinds.</i>
skin colour	The rind of a fruit or vegetable.
skin tone	A bag serving as a container for liquids; it is made from the hide of an animal.

tegument	The integument of an organism especially a parasitic flatworm.

- abrade** Scrape or wear away by friction or erosion.
*It was a landscape slowly **abraded** by a fine stinging dust.*
- bark** Remove the bark of a tree.
*A dog **barked** at her.*
- chafe** Rub (a part of the body) to restore warmth or sensation.
*It **chafed** him to be confined like this.*

cheat	Avoid (something undesirable) by luck or skill. <i>She always cheats at cards.</i>
clamber	Climb awkwardly, as if by scrambling. <i>I clambered out of the trench.</i>
cut	Form or shape by cutting or incising. <i>Investigators called for a machete to cut through the bush.</i>
defraud	Illegally obtain money from (someone) by deception. <i>She defrauded the customers who trusted her.</i>
exploit	Make use of (a situation) in a way considered unfair or underhand. <i>These workers are at particular risk of being exploited in the workplace.</i>
fleece	Cover as if with a fleece. <i>The sky was half blue half fleeced with white clouds.</i>
graze	Casually sample something. <i>We grazed up and down the TV channels.</i>
hull	Remove the hulls from. <i>Hull the berries.</i>
pare	Cut small bits or pare shavings from. <i>Pare apples.</i>
peel	Remove (the outer covering or skin) from a fruit or vegetable. <i>Oranges that peel easily.</i>
rub something raw	Move over something with pressure.
scramble	Make one's way quickly or awkwardly up a steep gradient or over rough ground by using one's hands as well as one's feet. <i>The Hurricanes were scrambled again this time meeting Italian fighters.</i>
scrape	Manage to live with difficulty. <i>The cat scraped at the armchair.</i>
shin	Climb awkwardly, as if by scrambling. <i>He shinned up a tree.</i>
shinny	Climb awkwardly, as if by scrambling. <i>He loved to shinny up that tree.</i>
sputter	Coat (a surface) with a spray of metal particles emitted from a target that is bombarded with fast ions. <i>But but she sputtered.</i>

struggle

Make one's way with difficulty.
*Before she could **struggle** he lifted her up.*

swindle

Deprive of by deceit.
*He was said to have **swindled** 62 5 million from the state owned cement industry.*

- acne** An inflammatory disease involving the sebaceous glands of the skin; characterized by papules or pustules or comedones.
*He was clean shaven with a face that had been ravaged by **acne** when younger.*
- allergic** Characterized by or caused by allergy.
*One and a half per cent of the population is **allergic** to bee venom.*
- bare** Lay bare.
*Leaf fall had left the trees **bare**.*
- bark** Tan a skin with bark tannins.
*He began **barking** out his orders.*
- chafe** (of an object) rub abrasively against another.
*He had a nasty **chafe** on his knee.*

cystic	Relating to the urinary bladder or the gall bladder. <i>The cystic stage.</i>
denudation	The removal of covering.
denude	Lay bare. <i>Almost overnight the Arctic was denuded of animals.</i>
dermatitis	A medical condition in which the skin becomes red, swollen, and sore, sometimes with small blisters, resulting from direct irritation of the skin by an external agent or an allergic reaction to it.
expose	Expose to light of photographic film. <i>At low tide the sands are exposed.</i>
exposed	In a vulnerable position or situation. <i>The army's exposed right flank was under attack.</i>
exposure	The intensity of light falling on a photographic film or plate. <i>They feared exposure of their campaign plans.</i>
integument	A tough outer protective layer, especially that of an animal or plant. <i>This chemical compound is found in the integument of the seed.</i>
itch	Cause to perceive an itch. <i>I itched all over.</i>
itching	An irritating cutaneous sensation that produces a desire to scratch.
lesion	Any localized abnormal structural change in a bodily part.
overexposure	Exposure of a film or a part of an image to light for too long a time. <i>She suffered from overexposure to noxious air.</i>
peel	An act of exfoliating dead skin in the cosmetic treatment of microdermabrasion. <i>Paint was peeling from the shopfronts.</i>
pigskin	Leather made from pigskin. <i>A pair of black pigskin gloves.</i>
rash	Any red eruption of the skin. <i>A rash of bank robberies.</i>
scar	Mark with a scar. <i>A faint scar ran the length of his left cheek.</i>
scrape	A place where soil has been scraped away especially a shallow hollow formed in the ground by a bird during a courtship display or for nesting. <i>The cat scraped at the armchair.</i>
scratch	An act or spell of scratching oneself to relieve itching. <i>He gave his scalp a good scratch.</i>

*It was not what it appeared to be on the **surface**.*
- undo** Cause the downfall or ruin of.
*There wasn't any way Evelyn could **undo** the damage.*
- undress** Get undressed.
*Please don't **undress** in front of everybody.*
- wart** An imperfection in someone or something that is suggestive of a wart especially in smallness or unattractiveness.
*What a bunch of nauseating little **warts** you are.*
