## Associations of "Skipped" (30 Words)

<a href="#">autumn</a>	The period from the autumn equinox to the winter solstice. <i>Europe can expect warmer summers and wetter <b>autumns</b>.</i>
<b>azalea</b>	A deciduous flowering shrub with clusters of brightly coloured, sometimes fragrant flowers. Azaleas are typically smaller than other rhododendrons and there are numerous cultivars.
<a href="#">backlash</a>	A strong negative reaction by a large number of people, especially to a social or political development. <i>There was a <b>backlash</b> of intolerance.</i>
<a href="#">bloom</a>	Coat (a lens) with a special surface layer so as to reduce reflection from its surface. <i>The cherry tree <b>bloomed</b>.</i>
<b>boreal</b>	Relating to or denoting the second climatic stage of the postglacial period in northern Europe between the Preboreal and Atlantic stages about 9 000 to 7 500 years ago marked by a warm dry climate. <i>Northern <b>boreal</b> forest.</i>
<b>bounce</b>	Hit something so that it bounces. <i>The ball <b>bounced</b> away and he chased it.</i>
<b>bungee</b>	A long nylon cased rubber band used for securing luggage and in bungee jumping. <i>He <b>bungeed</b> 111 metres from the bridge over the Victoria Falls.</i>
<a href="#">dance</a>	A social gathering at which people dance. <i>Their cheeks were pressed together as they <b>danced</b>.</i>
<b>efflorescent</b>	Bursting into flower.
<b>forth</b>	From a particular thing or place or position forth is obsolete. <i>Go <b>forth</b> and preach.</i>
<a href="#">frigid</a>	Extremely cold. <i>A <b>frigid</b> greeting.</i>

<b>heating</b>	Utility to warm a building. <i>We had no <b>heating</b> in our bedrooms.</i>
<b>hop</b>	A hopping movement. <i>He <b>hopped</b> down from the rock.</i>
<b><u>hurdle</u></b>	Jump over a hurdle or other obstacle while running. <i>The last <b>hurdle</b> before graduation.</i>
<b>icicle</b>	Ice resembling a pendent spear, formed by the freezing of dripping water.
<b><u>jolt</u></b>	An abrupt spasmodic movement. <i>The train <b>jolted</b> into motion.</i>
<b>jump</b>	Cause to jump or leap. <i>Every year hundreds of people <b>jump</b> off the Golden Gate bridge.</i>
<b><u>leap</u></b>	Cause to jump or leap. <i>Sales <b>leapt</b> by a third last year.</i>
<b>midwinter</b>	The middle of winter. <i>In <b>midwinter</b> the track became a muddy morass.</i>
<b>puissance</b>	Power to influence or coerce. <i>The <b>puissance</b> of the labor vote.</i>
<b>rap</b>	A type of popular music of US black origin in which words are recited rapidly and rhythmically over an instrumental backing. <i>There was a confident <b>rap</b> at the door.</i>
<b><u>rebound</u></b>	The act of securing possession of the rebounding basketball after a missed shot. <i>His shot hammered into the post and <b>rebounded</b> across the goal.</i>
<b>snowfall</b>	A fall of snow. <i>Heavy <b>snowfalls</b> made travel absolutely impossible.</i>
<b>spring</b>	Move rapidly or suddenly from a constrained position by or as if by the action of a spring. <i>He might <b>spring</b> a few shillings more.</i>
<b>summer</b>	Spend the summer in a particular place. <i><b>Summer</b> holidays.</i>
<b>techno</b>	A style of fast heavy electronic dance music usually without vocals.
<b>vernal</b>	Of, in, or appropriate to spring. <i>The <b>vernal</b> freshness of the land.</i>
<b>walking</b>	Close enough to be walked to. <i><b>Walking</b> is a healthy form of exercise.</i>
<b><u>winter</u></b>	Keep or feed plants or cattle during winter. <i>The tree has a good crop of berries in <b>winter</b>.</i>
