Associations of "Skipped" (30 Words)

autumn	The period from the autumn equinox to the winter solstice. <i>Europe can expect warmer summers and wetter autumns.</i>
azalea	A deciduous flowering shrub with clusters of brightly coloured, sometimes fragrant flowers. Azaleas are typically smaller than other rhododendrons and there are numerous cultivars.
backlash	A strong negative reaction by a large number of people, especially to a social or political development. <i>There was a backlash of intolerance.</i>
bloom	Coat (a lens) with a special surface layer so as to reduce reflection from its surface. <i>The cherry tree bloomed.</i>
boreal	Relating to or denoting the second climatic stage of the postglacial period in northern Europe between the Preboreal and Atlantic stages about 9 000 to 7 500 years ago marked by a warm dry climate. <i>Northern boreal forest.</i>
bounce	Hit something so that it bounces. <i>The ball bounced away and he chased it.</i>
bungee	A long nylon cased rubber band used for securing luggage and in bungee jumping. <i>He bungeed 111 metres from the bridge over the Victoria Falls.</i>
dance	A social gathering at which people dance. <i>Their cheeks were pressed together as they danced.</i>
efflorescent	Bursting into flower.
forth	From a particular thing or place or position forth is obsolete. <i>Go forth and preach.</i>
frigid	Extremely cold. <i>A frigid greeting.</i>

heating	Utility to warm a building. <i>We had no heating in our bedrooms.</i>
hop	A hopping movement. <i>He hopped down from the rock.</i>
<u>hurdle</u>	Jump over a hurdle or other obstacle while running. <i>The last hurdle before graduation.</i>
icicle	Ice resembling a pendent spear, formed by the freezing of dripping water.
<u>jolt</u>	An abrupt spasmodic movement. <i>The train jolted into motion.</i>
jump	Cause to jump or leap. <i>Every year hundreds of people jump off the Golden Gate bridge.</i>
<u>leap</u>	Cause to jump or leap. <i>Sales leapt by a third last year.</i>
midwinter	The middle of winter. <i>In midwinter the track became a muddy morass.</i>
puissance	Power to influence or coerce. <i>The puissance of the labor vote.</i>
rap	A type of popular music of US black origin in which words are recited rapidly and rhythmically over an instrumental backing. <i>There was a confident rap at the door.</i>
<u>rebound</u>	The act of securing possession of the rebounding basketball after a missed shot. <i>His shot hammered into the post and rebounded across the goal.</i>
snowfall	A fall of snow. <i>Heavy snowfalls made travel absolutely impossible.</i>
spring	Move rapidly or suddenly from a constrained position by or as if by the action of a spring. <i>He might spring a few shillings more.</i>
summer	Spend the summer in a particular place. <i>Summer holidays.</i>
techno	A style of fast heavy electronic dance music usually without vocals.
vernal	Of, in, or appropriate to spring. <i>The vernal freshness of the land.</i>
walking	Close enough to be walked to. <i>Walking is a healthy form of exercise.</i>
<u>winter</u>	Keep or feed plants or cattle during winter. <i>The tree has a good crop of berries in winter.</i>
