- *Moving and bending with ease.*
- *(of something abstract) barely sufficient in amount or basis.*
- *Having little width in proportion to the length or height.*

***Deficient** in common sense.*
- graceful** Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth.
*She was a tall girl slender and **graceful**.*
- inadequate** Lacking the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task.
*I felt like a fraud **inadequate** to the task.*
- inconsiderable** Of small size, amount, or extent.
*A not **inconsiderable** amount of money.*
- insubstantial** Lacking strength and solidity.
*The huts are relatively few and **insubstantial**.*
- insufficient** Not enough; inadequate.
***Insufficient** funds.*
- lean** Lacking excess flesh.
*A **lean** year.*

limited	Denoting a limited company used after a company name. <i>A limited circle of friends.</i>
lissom	(of a person or their body) thin, supple, and graceful. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to lissom teenagers.</i>
little	Small and of little importance. <i>Little time is left.</i>
meagre	(of a person or animal) lean; thin. <i>A tall meagre man.</i>
<u>modest</u>	Unassuming in the estimation of one's abilities or achievements. <i>A modest man of the people.</i>
<u>negligible</u>	Not worth considering. <i>He said that the risks were negligible.</i>
paltry	Contemptibly small in amount. <i>Naval glory struck him as paltry.</i>
rangy	(of a place) having room for ranging; expansive or spacious. <i>A pale rangy boy in his late teens.</i>
scant	Barely sufficient or adequate. <i>She weighed a scant two pounds.</i>
scanty	Small or insufficient in quantity or amount. <i>A scanty harvest.</i>
slight	Small in degree; inconsiderable. <i>She was slight and delicate looking.</i>
slim	Of a garment cut on slender lines designed to make the wearer appear slim. <i>A pair of slim immaculately cut trousers.</i>
small	Relatively moderate limited or small. <i>A small business.</i>
<u>sparse</u>	Thinly dispersed or scattered. <i>Trees were sparse.</i>
svelte	Moving and bending with ease. <i>She was svelte and sophisticated.</i>
sylphlike	(of a woman or girl) slender and graceful like a sylph. <i>His arm curled around her sylphlike waist.</i>
<u>thin</u>	Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous. <i>A thin reedy little voice.</i>
trifling	Not worth considering. <i>A trifling matter.</i>

willowy

(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe.
*A beautiful **willowy** blonde.*

cramped	Uncomfortably small or restricted. <i>Trying to bring children up in cramped high rise apartments.</i>
folk	Relating to folk music. <i>An old folks home.</i>
gangly	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.
grace	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>There but for the grace of God go I.</i>
graceful	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and graceful.</i>
gully	A fielder at gully. <i>He was caught in the gully by Jones.</i>
lank	Of a person lanky. <i>The man had lank brown greasy hair.</i>
lanky	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs. <i>A lanky kid transformed almost overnight into a handsome young man.</i>
lissom	Moving and bending with ease. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to lissom teenagers.</i>
lithe	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. <i>She lay gazing up at his tall lithe figure.</i>
narrow	A narrow channel connecting two larger areas of water. <i>The road narrowed and crossed an old bridge.</i>
orphan	Make a child an orphan. <i>John was orphaned at 12.</i>
refined	Precise to a fine degree. <i>Refined people with refined taste.</i>
silhouette	Project on a background such as a screen like a silhouette. <i>The castle was silhouetted against the sky.</i>
skinny	A skinny person. <i>In the winter I live in skinny jeans and boots.</i>
slim	A course or period of slimming. <i>A slim girl with straight blonde hair.</i>
small	A garment size for a small person. <i>Cut the okra up small.</i>

sophisticated	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>A sophisticated audience.</i>
supple	(used of persons' bodies) capable of moving or bending freely. <i>These boots are not yet suppled by frequent use.</i>
svelte	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>She was svelte and sophisticated.</i>
tall	A garment size for a tall person. <i>A tall story.</i>
tapered	Becoming gradually narrower. <i>Trousers with tapered legs.</i>
thin	Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous. <i>The blood was flowing thin.</i>
thinness	The quality of air containing less oxygen than normal. <i>The thinness of the line between tolerance and blackmail.</i>
tiny	Very small. <i>Tiny feet.</i>
urbane	Courteous and refined in manner (typically used of a man). <i>Urbane wit was the mark of taste and cultivation.</i>
waif	A young person who is thin and looks unhealthy or uncared for. <i>She is foster mother to various waifs and strays.</i>
willowy	Slender and graceful. <i>Willowy meadow land.</i>
