#### Definitions of "Slick" as a noun

- A person who is smooth and persuasive but untrustworthy.
- A trowel used to make a surface slick.
- A racing-car or bicycle tyre without a tread, for use in dry weather conditions.
- An application or amount of a glossy or oily substance.



- An oil slick.
- A film of oil or garbage floating on top of water.
- A glossy magazine.
- A slippery smoothness.
- A magazine printed on good quality paper.

# Slick as a Verb

#### Definitions of "Slick" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "slick" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Make slick or smooth.
- Give a smooth and glossy appearance.
- Cover with a film of liquid; make wet or slippery.
- Make (one's hair) flat, smooth, and glossy by applying water, oil, or gel to it.





# Synonyms of "Slick" as a verb (13 Words)

<u>cream</u>	Make creamy by beating. She <b>cream</b> s her face every night.
daub	Apply to a surface. <b>Daub</b> the ceiling with plaster.
flatten	Raze (a building or settlement) to the ground. Guy <b>flatten</b> ed himself against the wall.
plaster	Coat with plaster. <b>Plaster</b> the broken arm.
<u>rub</u>	Scrape or rub as if to relieve itching. Many insects make noises by <b>rub</b> bing parts of their bodies together.
<u>slap</u>	Hit against or into something with the sound of something being slapped. <i>My sister</i> <b>slap</b> <i>ped my face.</i>
slather	Spread or smear (a substance) thickly or liberally. I can t eat bagels without <b>slather</b> ing them with cream cheese.



- sleek Make (hair) smooth and glossy.
- Her black hair was **sleek**ed down.

sleek down Make slick or smooth.

**slick down** Give a smooth and glossy appearance.

Make smooth or smoother as if by rubbing.

<u>smooth</u> Values are collected over a long period of time so that fluctuations are **smooth**ed out.

**smother** Extinguish (a fire) by covering it.

**Smother** a yawn.

**spread** Cover by spreading something over. *He spread fertilizer over the lawn.* 





### Usage Examples of "Slick" as a verb

- She woke to find her body slicked with sweat.
- Slick one's hair.
- His damp hair was slicked back.
- A rain-slicked road.



# **Slick as an Adjective**

### Definitions of "Slick" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "slick" as an adjective can have the following definitions:



- (of skin or hair) smooth and glossy.
- Marked by skill in deception.
- Having a smooth, gleaming surface reflecting light.
- Made slick by e.g. ice or grease.
- Having only superficial plausibility.
- (of a surface) smooth, wet, and slippery.
- Superficially impressive, but lacking depth and attention to the true complexities of a subject.
- Smooth and superficially impressive but insincere or shallow.
- Done or operating in an impressively smooth and efficient way.


crafty	(of something pleasurable) consumed or done in an unplanned, surreptitious way. A <b>crafty</b> crook faked an injury to escape from prison.
<u>cunning</u>	Attractive especially by means of smallness or prettiness or quaintness. <i>Cunning</i> men often pass for wise.
dodgy	Of low quality. A <b>dodgy</b> second hand car salesman.
efficient	Able to accomplish a purpose; functioning effectively-G.B.Shaw. An <i>efficient</i> production manager.
<u>facile</u>	Superficially impressive, but lacking depth and attention to the true complexities of a subject. <i>Too facile</i> a solution for so complex a problem.
<u>fluent</u>	Smooth and unconstrained in movement. She became <b>fluent</b> in French and German.
foxy	Sexually attractive (typically used of a woman. A <b>foxy</b> method to miss conscription.
glassy	Having the physical properties of glass; vitreous. She d got that <b>glassy</b> look.
<u>glib</u>	Artfully persuasive in speech. <i>Glib</i> generalizations.
glossy	Having a surface made smooth and glossy especially by pressing between rollers. <i>A 16 page glossy brochure.</i>
greasy	Containing an unusual amount of grease or oil. <i>He wiped his <b>greasy</b> fingers.</i>
guileful	Having or showing sly or cunning intelligence. A supremely <b>guileful</b> and deceptive politician.
icy	Very unfriendly; hostile. <i>Icy</i> stare.
knavish	Dishonest or unscrupulous. His <b>knavish</b> tricks will be frustrated.
neat	Arranged in a tidy way; in good order. It was a <b>neat</b> plan but bound to fail.
oily	Covered or soaked with oil. <i>The <b>oily</b> swell of the river.</i>
pat	Having only superficial plausibility. A <b>pat</b> reply.



plausible	Apparently reasonable and credible, and therefore convincing. <i>A <b>plausible</b> liar</i> .
<u>polished</u>	To trim and smooth. A <b>polished</b> mahogany table.
satiny	Having a smooth, glossy surface or finish like that of satin. <i>The walls glow with a <b>satiny</b> sheen.</i>
shining	Giving out or reflecting bright light. <i>Shining</i> white enamel.
<u>shiny</u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i>Shiny black shoes.</i>
silken	Having a smooth, gleaming surface reflecting light. <i>Silken eyelashes.</i>
silklike	Having a smooth, gleaming surface reflecting light. A <b>silklike</b> fabric.
silky	Of or resembling silk, especially in being soft, fine, and lustrous. <i>Silky skin</i> .
<u>sleek</u>	Ingratiating; unctuous. She gave Guy a <b>sleek</b> smile to underline her words.
slippery	Not to be trusted. A <b>slippery</b> bar of soap.
slithery	Having a slippery surface or quality. <i>Slithery</i> mud.
<u>sly</u>	Having or showing a cunning and deceitful nature. A <b>sly</b> manipulative woman.
<u>smooth</u>	Music without breaks between notes smooth and connected. A <b>smooth</b> road.
streamlined	Made efficient by stripping off nonessentials. <i>This streamlined</i> approach will significantly reduce the learning curve for new users.
<u>superficial</u>	Situated or occurring on the skin or immediately beneath it. The building suffered only <b>superficial</b> damage.
tricksy	Ingenious, intricate, or complicated. A <b>tricksy</b> little device.
<u>tricky</u>	Having concealed difficulty. Applying eyeliner can be a <b>tricky</b> business.
well organized	Resulting favorably.
well run	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.



wetContaining moisture or volatile components.<br/>Wet sidewalks.wilyMarked by skill in deception.<br/>A wily old attorney.

brightly	In an intelligent and quick-witted way. <b>Brightly</b> painted fingernails.
<u>fluid</u>	Characteristic of a fluid capable of flowing and easily changing shape. <i>Her movements were <b>fluid</b> and beautiful to watch.</i>
<u>glistening</u>	Reflecting light. <i>Glistening</i> bodies of swimmers.
glossy	Having a surface made smooth and glossy especially by pressing between rollers. A <b>glossy</b> TV miniseries.
grease	Lubricate with grease. <i>Grease</i> the wheels.



lamp	Hunt at night using lamps especially for rabbits. Inspectors can <b>lamp</b> the lines between the manholes for routine maintenance observations.
lubricant	A substance capable of reducing friction by making surfaces smooth or slippery. <i>The pipe ends had been smeared with <b>lubricant</b>.</i>
lubricate	Have lubricating properties. Men <b>lubricate</b> d with alcohol speak their true feelings.
lustrous	Reflecting light. She brushed her hair until it fell in <b>lustrous</b> auburn waves.
oil	Cover with oil as if by rubbing. Potatoes fried in vegetable <b>oil</b> .
parquetry	Inlaid work of blocks of various woods arranged in a geometric pattern, especially for flooring or furniture. Many candled lustres reflected in the polished <b>parquetry</b> .
polish	A preparation used in polishing. <b>Polish</b> your social manners.
<u>polished</u>	(of lumber or stone) to trim and smooth. Freshly <b>polished</b> silver.
sheen	Shine or cause to shine softly. Black crushed velvet with a slight <b>sheen</b> .
shine	Make a surface shine. Tonight he will have a chance to <b>shine</b> and win a world boxing title.
shining	Marked by exceptional merit. A <b>shining</b> example.
<u>shiny</u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i>Shiny</i> black patents.
<u>sleek</u>	Make slick or smooth. He was tall with <b>sleek</b> dark hair.
<u>sliding</u>	Able to be adjusted or adapted. The tank should have a <b>sliding</b> glass cover.
<u>slimy</u>	Covered by or resembling slime. A <b>slimy</b> little liar.
slippery	Causing or tending to cause things to slip or slide. <i>Slippery</i> ice.
<u>smooth</u>	Smooth and unconstrained in movement. The trucks gave a <b>smooth</b> ride.



<u>sparkling</u>	Shining brightly with flashes of light. <i>Sparkling wines.</i>
<u>sticky</u>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. A <b>sticky</b> question.
streamlined	Designed or arranged to offer the least resistant to fluid flow. This <b>streamlined</b> approach will significantly reduce the learning curve for new users.
texture	Give something a rough or uneven texture. Breadfruit has the same <b>texture</b> as bread.
<u>viscosity</u>	A quantity expressing the magnitude of internal friction in a fluid, as measured by the force per unit area resisting uniform flow. <i>Cooling the fluid raises its viscosity.</i>
vitreous	Having the surface made shiny and nonporous by fusing a vitreous solution to it. <i>Vitreous</i> china.
wick	Absorb or draw off (liquid) by capillary action. The physician put a <b>wick</b> in the wound to drain it.
