<u>ambush</u>	Hunt quarry by stalking and ambushing. They were <b>ambush</b> ed and taken prisoner by the enemy.
blunder	Make a stupid or careless mistake; act or speak clumsily. <i>He <b>blunder</b>ed his stupid ideas.</i>
<u>climb</u>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. This young man knows how to <b>climb</b> the social ladder.
<u>crawl</u>	Feel as if crawling with insects. European children learn the breast stroke they often don t know how to crawl.
<u>curve</u>	A line on a graph whether straight or curved showing how one quantity varies with respect to another. Starting with arms outstretched <b>curve</b> the body sideways.
err	Fail to adhere to the proper or accepted standards; do wrong. The judge had <b>err</b> ed in ruling that the evidence was inadmissible.
gaffe	An unintentional act or remark causing embarrassment to its originator; a blunder. In my first few months at work I made some real <b>gaffe</b> s.
<u>glide</u>	Fly in or as if in a glider plane. <i>Students learning to <b>glide</b>.</i>
ground	Confine or restrict to the ground. A <b>ground</b> assault.
<u>hill</u>	Form into a hill. <i>If frost threatens our new plants we <b>hill</b> them up.</i>
ice	A rink with a floor of ice for ice hockey or ice skating. She scraped the <b>ice</b> off the windscreen.
inadvertence	An unintentional omission resulting from failure to notice something.



lapse	A brief or temporary failure of concentration, memory, or judgement. <i>The country has <b>lapse</b>d into chaos.</i>
lubricity	Feeling morbid sexual desire or a propensity to lewdness.
<u>omission</u>	A person or thing that has been left out or excluded. There are glaring <b>omission</b> s in the report.
oversight	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>He had simply missed Parsons out by an</i> <b>oversight</b> .
pounce	The act of pouncing. The paper <b>pounce</b> d on her admission that she is still a member of CND.
<u>rebound</u>	The act of securing possession of the rebounding basketball after a missed shot. <b>Rebound</b> hypertension.
remittance	A sum of money sent in payment or as a gift. <b>Remittance</b> may be made by credit card.
skid	Cause to skid. Her car <b>skid</b> ded and hit the grass verge.
sledge	Ride in or travel with a sledge. They <b>sledge</b> d down the slopes in the frozen snow.
<u>sliding</u>	Moving smoothly, quickly, or unobtrusively. The tank should have a <b>sliding</b> glass cover.
slip	A fielder at slip. Water <b>slip</b> ped from the polished marble.
<u>slither</u>	A slithering movement. We <b>slither</b> ed down a snowy mountain track.
smoothly	Without problems or difficulties. Traffic was soon flowing <b>smoothly</b> again.
snake	Something long thin and flexible that resembles a snake. The <b>snake</b> did not have any provision for strong currency nations to help the weak.
snow	Falls of snow. Vanilla <b>snow</b> .
solecism	A breach of good manners; an instance of incorrect behaviour.
swoop	Seize with a swooping motion. The violinist was indulgent with his <b>swoop</b> s and slides.
walk	Allow or enable a batter to walk. She <b>walk</b> s with a slight limp.
