ambush	Hunt quarry by stalking and ambushing. <i>They were ambushed and taken prisoner by the enemy.</i>
blunder	Make a stupid or careless mistake; act or speak clumsily. <i>He blundered his stupid ideas.</i>
climb	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>This young man knows how to climb the social ladder.</i>
crawl	Feel as if crawling with insects. <i>European children learn the breast stroke they often don't know how to crawl.</i>
curve	A line on a graph whether straight or curved showing how one quantity varies with respect to another. <i>Starting with arms outstretched curve the body sideways.</i>
err	Fail to adhere to the proper or accepted standards; do wrong. <i>The judge had erred in ruling that the evidence was inadmissible.</i>
gaffe	An unintentional act or remark causing embarrassment to its originator; a blunder. <i>In my first few months at work I made some real gaffes.</i>
glide	Fly in or as if in a glider plane. <i>Students learning to glide.</i>
ground	Confine or restrict to the ground. <i>A ground assault.</i>
hill	Form into a hill. <i>If frost threatens our new plants we hill them up.</i>
ice	A rink with a floor of ice for ice hockey or ice skating. <i>She scraped the ice off the windscreen.</i>
inadvertence	An unintentional omission resulting from failure to notice something.

lapse	A brief or temporary failure of concentration, memory, or judgement. <i>The country has lapsed into chaos.</i>
lubricity	Feeling morbid sexual desire or a propensity to lewdness.
<u>omission</u>	A person or thing that has been left out or excluded. <i>There are glaring omissions in the report.</i>
oversight	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>He had simply missed Parsons out by an oversight.</i>
pounce	The act of pouncing. <i>The paper pounced on her admission that she is still a member of CND.</i>
<u>rebound</u>	The act of securing possession of the rebounding basketball after a missed shot. <i>Rebound hypertension.</i>
remittance	A sum of money sent in payment or as a gift. <i>Remittance may be made by credit card.</i>
skid	Cause to skid. <i>Her car skidded and hit the grass verge.</i>
sledge	Ride in or travel with a sledge. <i>They sledged down the slopes in the frozen snow.</i>
<u>sliding</u>	Moving smoothly, quickly, or unobtrusively. <i>The tank should have a sliding glass cover.</i>
slip	A fielder at slip. <i>Water slipped from the polished marble.</i>
<u>slither</u>	A slithering movement. <i>We slithered down a snowy mountain track.</i>
smoothly	Without problems or difficulties. <i>Traffic was soon flowing smoothly again.</i>
snake	Something long thin and flexible that resembles a snake. <i>The snake did not have any provision for strong currency nations to help the weak.</i>
snow	Falls of snow. <i>Vanilla snow.</i>
solecism	A breach of good manners; an instance of incorrect behaviour.
swoop	Seize with a swooping motion. <i>The violinist was indulgent with his swoops and slides.</i>
walk	Allow or enable a batter to walk. <i>She walks with a slight limp.</i>
