| additive | A substance added to something in small quantities to improve or preserve it. <i>An additive process.</i> |
| blunder | Commit a faux pas or a fault or make a serious mistake. <i>We were blundering around in the darkness.</i> |
| curve | A pitch of a baseball that is thrown with spin so that its path curves as it approaches the batter. <i>The vehicle rounded a curve.</i> |
| friction | The resistance that one surface or object encounters when moving over another. <i>The friction of braking.</i> |
| glass | Cover or enclose with glass. <i>Glass in a porch.</i> |
| glide | The activity of flying a glider. <i>Slide your hands firmly across the shoulders then glide them down.</i> |
| ice | An ice cream ice lolly or portion of water ice. <i>An iced summer drink.</i> |
| inadvertence | An unintentional omission resulting from failure to notice something. |
| lapse | (of a right, privilege, or agreement) become invalid because it is not used, claimed, or renewed; expire. <i>If your diet has lapsed it's time you revived it.</i> |
| lubricant | A substance used for lubricating an engine or component, such as oil or grease. <i>The pipe ends had been smeared with lubricant.</i> |
| lubricity | Feeling morbid sexual desire or a propensity to lewdness. |
| oil | Administer an oil or ointment to often in a religious ceremony of blessing. <i>Oil the wooden surface.</i> |

| oversight | An unintentional omission resulting from failure to notice something. <i>Was the mistake due to oversight.</i> |
| skid | Cause to skid. <i>They skidded the logs down the hill to the waterfront.</i> |
| sledge | Travel or slide downhill over snow on a sledge. <i>They sledged down the slopes in the frozen snow.</i> |
| <u>slick</u> | An oil slick. <i>His damp hair was slicked back.</i> |
| <u>slide</u> | A structure with a smooth sloping surface for children to slide down. <i>His slide didn't stop until the bottom of the hill.</i> |
| <u>slimy</u> | Repellently smooth and obsequious. <i>Thick slimy mud.</i> |
| slip | A slippery smoothness. <i>Sarah slipped into a red jacket.</i> |
| slippery | Not to be trusted. <i>How extraordinarily slippery a liar the camera is.</i> |
| <u>slither</u> | A slithering movement. <i>I spied a baby adder slithering away.</i> |
| <u>smooth</u> | Without breaks between notes smooth and connected. <i>A lovely smooth very fruity wine.</i> |
| smoothly | In a smooth way. <i>The bust is smoothly carved in white marble.</i> |
| snake | Move or extend with the twisting motion of a snake. <i>The snake did not have any provision for strong currency nations to help the weak.</i> |
| snow | A layer of snowflakes white crystals of frozen water covering the ground. <i>They would snow the public into believing that all was well.</i> |
| soft | In a relaxed manner or without hardship soft is nonstandard. <i>He was too soft for the army.</i> |
| texture | Give something a rough or uneven texture. <i>The texture of Neapolitan life.</i> |
| toboggan | Move along on a luge or toboggan. <i>We tobogganed down a steep hill nearby.</i> |
| translucent | (of a substance) allowing light, but not detailed shapes, to pass through; semi-transparent. <i>Her beautiful translucent skin.</i> |
