despicable Morally reprehensible.

Fawning adoration.

Containing or cooked with too much oil or fat.

grovelling Totally submissive.

His **grovelling** references to great historians.



humble Marked by meekness or modesty; not arrogant or prideful.

I felt very **humble** when meeting her.

ingratiating Calculated to please or gain favor.

A smooth **ingratiating** manner.

miry (of soil) soft and watery.

Miry roads.

Mildly pornographic.

mucky Mucky books.

Clouded as with sediment.

muddy Muddy coffee.

Obedient or attentive to an excessive or servile degree.

Obsequious Obsequious Obsequious Obsequious

oily Smeared or soiled with grease or oil.

Oily puddles in the streets.

oleaginous Containing an unusual amount of grease or oil.

oozy Cleaginous seeds.

Leaking out slowly.

reptilian Of or relating to the class Reptilia.

A **reptilian** villain with no redeeming features.

slavish Abjectly submissive; characteristic of a slave or servant- S.H.Adams.

Slavish devotion to her job ruled her life.

slimed Covered with or resembling slime.

(of a word or concept) elusive in meaning because changing according to

slippery one's point of view.

Her hand was **slippery** with sweat. Having a slippery surface or quality.

slithery *Slithery mud*.

Sittlery III.

Prepared to obey others unquestioningly.

<u>subservient</u> The whole narration is **subservient** to the moral plan of exemplifying twelve

virtues in twelve knights.

Attempting to win favor from influential people by flattery.

sycophantic A **sycophantic** interview.

toadyish Attempting to win favor by flattery.

unctuous (chiefly of minerals) having a greasy or soapy feel.

The **unctuous** Uriah Heep.

unworthy Not deserving.

Dispel a student whose conduct is deemed **unworthy**.



vile Extremely unpleasant.

Vile smells.

worthless (of a person) having no good qualities; deserving contempt.

That promise is worthless.

wretched Characterized by physical misery.

She disliked the **wretched** man intensely.

Not completely dried and slightly sticky to the touch. **tacky**

viscid Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.

The **viscid** mucus lining of the intestine.

The state of being thick, sticky, and semi-fluid in consistency, due to internal

viscosity friction.

Cooling the fluid raises its **viscosity**.

Having a relatively high resistance to flow.

Viscous lava.
