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actually	As the truth or facts of a situation; really. We must pay attention to what young people are <b>actually</b> doing.
already	Prior to a specified or implied time. Anna has suffered a great deal <b>already</b> .
<u>anyhow</u>	In any way whatsoever. They came <b>anyhow</b> they could.
<u>anyway</u>	Used to end a conversation, to change the subject, or to resume a subject after interruption. Nobody invited Miss Honey to sit down but she sat down <b>anyway</b> .
<u>assuredly</u>	Confidently. The lad kept his cool and <b>assuredly</b> slipped the ball between the posts.
<u>certainly</u>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm s appeal.</i>
<u>despite</u>	Contempt; disdain. She wanted neither favor nor <b>despite</b> .
<u>doubtless</u>	Certainly; without doubt. <i>The company would <b>doubtless</b> find the reduced competition to their</i> <i>liking.</i>
<u>evidently</u>	It would seem that. She was in bed and <b>evidently</b> in great pain.
<u>gradually</u>	In a gradual way; slowly; by degrees. The snake moved <b>gradually</b> toward its victim.
heretofore	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i>Diseases that heretofore were usually confined to rural areas.</i>



hitherto	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. <i>Hitherto</i> part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.
however	In whatever way; regardless of how. He was hesitant to take the risk <b>however</b> small.
indeed	Used to introduce a further and stronger or more surprising point. <i>Was indeed grateful.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.
<u>merely</u>	Just; only. I was <b>merely</b> asking.
<u>nevertheless</u>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession. Statements which although literally true are <b>nevertheless</b> misleading.
<u>nonetheless</u>	In spite of that; nevertheless. The rally which the government had declared illegal was <b>nonetheless</b> attended by some 6 000.
notwithstanding	Nevertheless; in spite of this. I didn't like it. <b>Notwithstanding</b> , I remained calm.
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Obvious</i> errors.
obviously	Unmistakably (`plain' is often used informally for `plainly. <b>Obviously</b> everyone has to do what they think is right.
really	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. They don t <b>really</b> listen to us.
<u>simply</u>	And nothing more. It s <b>simply</b> beautiful.
suffix	Attach a suffix to. <i>Suffix</i> words.
<u>though</u>	However. I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce <b>though</b> .
<u>truly</u>	With sincerity; without pretense. A <b>truly</b> dreadful song.
<u>undoubtedly</u>	Without doubt; certainly. They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.



unquestionably	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <b>Unquestionably</b> the loss of his father was a grievous blow.
<u>whatever</u>	One or some or every or all without specification. <i>We told him we d back him <b>whatever</b></i> .
<u>yet</u>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession. I hope to continue for some time <b>yet</b> .
