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Associations of "Slowly but surely" (30 Words)

actually	As the truth or facts of a situation; really. <i>We must pay attention to what young people are actually doing.</i>
already	Prior to a specified or implied time. <i>Anna has suffered a great deal already.</i>
<u>anyhow</u>	In any way whatsoever. <i>They came anyhow they could.</i>
<u>anyway</u>	Used to end a conversation, to change the subject, or to resume a subject after interruption. <i>Nobody invited Miss Honey to sit down but she sat down anyway.</i>
<u>assuredly</u>	Confidently. <i>The lad kept his cool and assuredly slipped the ball between the posts.</i>
<u>certainly</u>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm's appeal.</i>
<u>despite</u>	Contempt; disdain. <i>She wanted neither favor nor despite.</i>
<u>doubtless</u>	Certainly; without doubt. <i>The company would doubtless find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>
<u>evidently</u>	It would seem that. <i>She was in bed and evidently in great pain.</i>
<u>gradually</u>	In a gradual way; slowly; by degrees. <i>The snake moved gradually toward its victim.</i>
heretofore	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i>Diseases that heretofore were usually confined to rural areas.</i>

hitherto	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. Hitherto part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.
however	In whatever way; regardless of how. He was hesitant to take the risk however small.
<u>indeed</u>	Used to introduce a further and stronger or more surprising point. Was indeed grateful.
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. It was immediately and indubitably apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.
<u>merely</u>	Just; only. I was merely asking.
<u>nevertheless</u>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). Statements which although literally true are nevertheless misleading.
<u>nonetheless</u>	In spite of that; nevertheless. The rally which the government had declared illegal was nonetheless attended by some 6 000.
notwithstanding	Nevertheless; in spite of this. I didn't like it. Notwithstanding , I remained calm.
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. Obvious errors.
obviously	Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly'). Obviously everyone has to do what they think is right.
really	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. They don't really listen to us.
<u>simply</u>	And nothing more. It's simply beautiful.
suffix	Attach a suffix to. Suffix words.
<u>though</u>	However. I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce though .
<u>truly</u>	With sincerity; without pretense. A truly dreadful song.
<u>undoubtedly</u>	Without doubt; certainly. They are undoubtedly guilty.

unquestionably In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question.
***Unquestionably** the loss of his father was a grievous blow.*

whatever One or some or every or all without specification.
*We told him we'd back him **whatever**.*

yet Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession).
*I hope to continue for some time **yet**.*
