## Synonyms of "Slumber" as a noun (7 Words)

**catnap** Sleeping for a short period of time (usually not in bed).

**doze** A light fitful sleep.  
*I think I ll have a **doze** he said closing his eyes.*

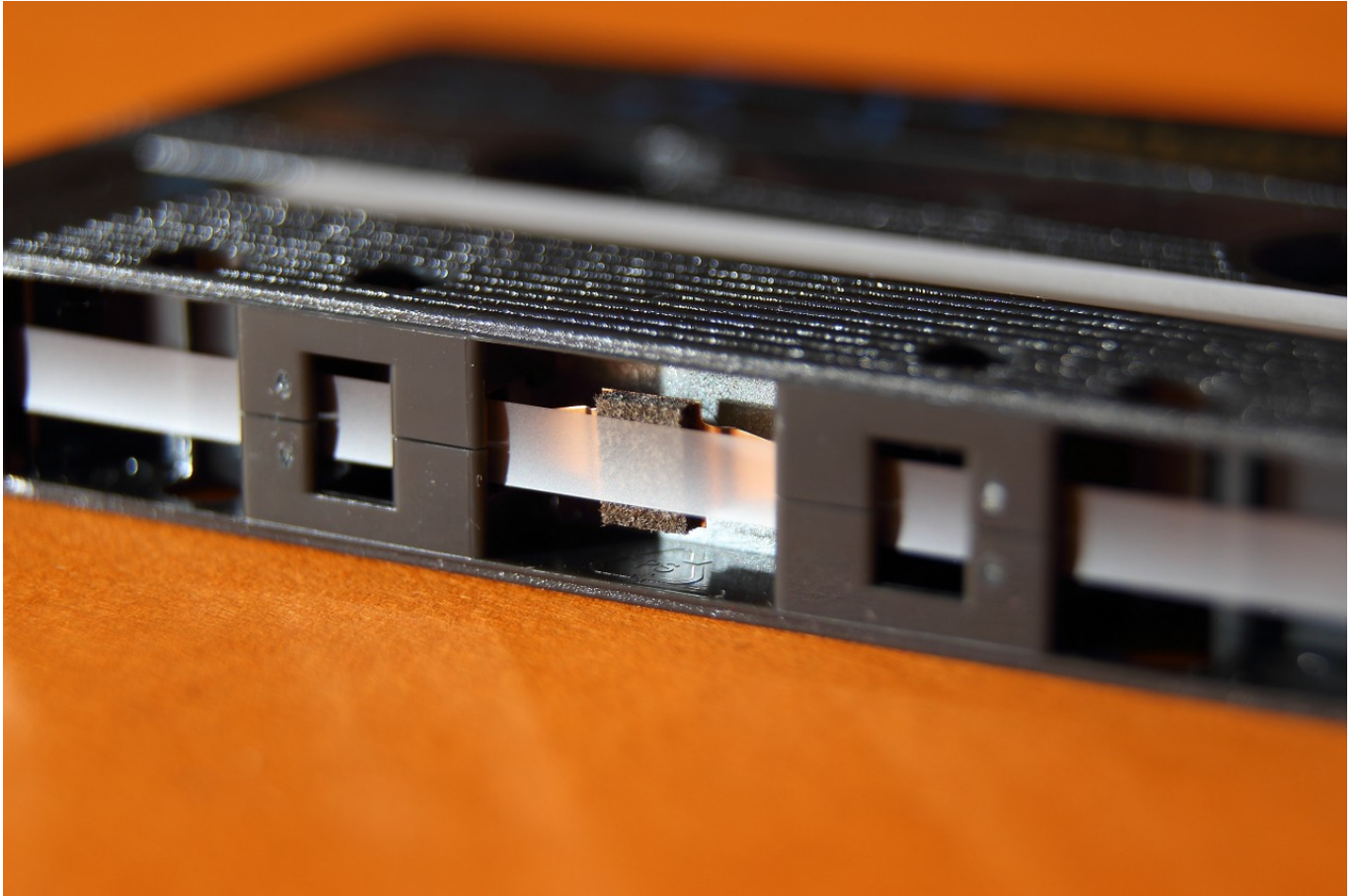
**drowse** A light sleep; a condition of being half asleep.  
*She awoke from a light **drowse**.*

**nap** A card game similar to whist; usually played for stakes.  
*There wasn t time for a **nap**.*

**rest** An instance or period of resting.  
*The car accelerates rapidly from **rest**.*

**siesta** An afternoon rest or nap, especially one taken during the hottest hours of the day in a hot climate.  
*Everyone had a **siesta** for a few hours.*

**sleep** A gummy secretion found in the corners of the eyes after sleep.  
*He talked in his **sleep**.*



## Usage Examples of "Slumber" as a noun

- *Scaring folk from their slumbers.*
- *Calm as a child in dreamless slumber.*

### Definitions of "Slumber" as a verb

- *Sleep.*
- *Be asleep.*



## Synonyms of "Slumber" as a verb (12 Words)

- be asleep**      Happen, occur, take place.
- catch some z's**      Perceive by hearing.
- catnap**      Have a short sleep during the day.  
*Carradine **catnapped** in a hammock between two chairs.*
- doze**      Sleep lightly or for a short period of time.  
*I **dozed** off for a few seconds.*
- drowse**      Be half asleep; doze intermittently.  
*Any birds which the heat has not utterly **drowsed**.*
- kip**      Be asleep.
- log z's**      Cut lumber, as in woods and forests.

<b>nap</b>	Sleep lightly or briefly, especially during the day. <i>She took to <b>napping</b> on the beach in the afternoons.</i>
<b>rest</b>	Give a rest to. <i><b>Rest</b> assured.</i>
<b>sleep</b>	Be in a state of sleep be asleep. <i>He <b>sleeps</b> in Holywell cemetery.</i>
<b>take a nap</b>	Experience or feel or submit to.
<b>take a siesta</b>	Be seized or affected in a specified way.



### Usage Examples of "Slumber" as a verb

- *Sleeping Beauty slumbered in her forest castle.*
- *The village street slumbered under the afternoon sun.*



## Associations of "Slumber" (30 Words)

<b>awake</b>	Mentally perceptive and responsive. <i>Was now <b>awake</b> to the reality of his predicament.</i>
<b>awaken</b>	Stop sleeping. <i>Anna was <b>awakened</b> by the telephone.</i>
<b>bedding</b>	A display of bedding plants. <i>A <b>bedding</b> course of sand.</i>
<b>bedtime</b>	The usual time when someone goes to bed. <i>A <b>bedtime</b> story.</i>
<b>daydream</b>	Have a daydream indulge in a fantasy. <i>She was lost in a <b>daydream</b>.</i>
<b>deep</b>	Far down or in deeply. <i>A <b>deep</b> bow.</i>

<b>dormancy</b>	The state in which a plant is alive but not actively growing. <i>Some large volcanoes spend thousands of years in a state of <b>dormancy</b>.</i>
<b>doze</b>	Sleep lightly. <i>I <b>dozed</b> off for a few seconds.</i>
<b><u>dreaming</u></b>	Imaginative thoughts indulged in while awake.
<b>dreamy</b>	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>The atmosphere is tranquil and <b>dreamy</b>.</i>
<b>drowse</b>	Be on the verge of sleeping. <i>He was beginning to <b>drowse</b> in his chair.</i>
<b><u>drowsy</u></b>	Half asleep. <i>The <b>drowsy</b> heat of the meadows.</i>
<b>hibernate</b>	(of an animal or plant) spend the winter in a dormant state. <i>Bears must eat a lot of food before they <b>hibernate</b> in their caves.</i>
<b>hibernation</b>	Cessation from or slowing of activity during the winter; especially slowing of metabolism in some animals. <i>We shut down went into <b>hibernation</b> for a week.</i>
<b>hypnotism</b>	The study or practice of hypnosis.
<b>hypnotize</b>	Induce hypnosis in. <i>A witness had been <b>hypnotized</b> to enhance his memory.</i>
<b>insomnia</b>	Habitual sleeplessness; inability to sleep.
<b>loll</b>	(of a part of the body) hang loosely; droop. <i>He slumped against a tree trunk his head <b>lolling</b> back.</i>
<b><u>midnight</u></b>	The middle period of the night. <i>The <b>midnight</b> hours.</i>
<b>nap</b>	Sleeping for a short period of time (usually not in bed). <i>She <b>naps</b> everyday after lunch for an hour.</i>
<b><u>nightmare</u></b>	A terrifying or deeply upsetting dream. <i>The <b>nightmare</b> of racial hatred.</i>
<b>oversleep</b>	Sleep longer than intended. <i>We talked until the early hours and consequently I <b>overslept</b>.</i>
<b>rouse</b>	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i><b>Rouse</b> the cable out.</i>
<b>sleep</b>	Be in a state of sleep be asleep. <i>He <b>sleeps</b> in Holywell cemetery.</i>
<b>snore</b>	The act of snoring or producing a snoring sound. <i>She complained that her husband <b>snores</b>.</i>



**subconscious** The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred.

*My **subconscious** fear.*

**tonight** During the night of the present day.

***Tonight** is a night to remember.*

**wake** Cause to become awake or conscious.

*The motorboat s **wake** capsized the canoe.*

**waken** Cause to become awake or conscious.

*They combined to **waken** a forgotten and futile hope.*

**waking** Marked by full consciousness or alertness.

*Days of danger and nights of **waking**.*
