An instance or period of resting. rest The car accelerates rapidly from **rest**.


An afternoon rest or nap, especially one taken during the hottest hours of the day siesta in a hot climate.

sleep He talked in his **sleep**.






Usage Examples of "Slumber" as a noun

- Calm as a child in dreamless slumber.







Carradine catnapped in a hammock between two chairs.

doze Sleep lightly or for a short period of time.

I dozed off for a few seconds.

drowseBe half asleep; doze intermittently.

Any birds which the heat has not utterly **drowse**d.

kip Be asleep.

log z's Cut lumber, as in woods and forests.



nap Sleep lightly or briefly, especially during the day.

She took to **nap**ping on the beach in the afternoons.

Give a rest to. **Rest** assured.

sleep

Be in a state of sleep be asleep.

He sleeps in Holywell cemetery.

take a nap Experience or feel or submit to.


take a siesta Be seized or affected in a specified way.

hibernate (of an animal or plant) spend the winter in a dormant state.

Bears must eat a lot of food before they **hibernate** in their caves.

Cessation from or slowing of activity during the winter; especially slowing

hibernation of metabolism in some animals.

We shut down went into **hibernation** for a week.

hypnotism The study or practice of hypnosis.

hypnotize Induce hypnosis in.

A witness had been **hypnotize**d to enhance his memory.

insomnia Habitual sleeplessness; inability to sleep.

loll (of a part of the body) hang loosely; droop.

He slumped against a tree trunk his head **loll**ing back.

midnight The middle period of the night.

The **midnight** hours.

nap Sleeping for a short period of time (usually not in bed.

She **nap**s everyday after lunch for an hour.

nightmare A terrifying or deeply upsetting dream.

The **nightmare** of racial hatred.
