

## Synonyms of "Smashed" as an adjective (29 Words)

befuddled	Stupefied by alcoholic drink. The wino s poor <b>befuddled</b> mind.
<b>besotted</b>	Strongly infatuated. <i>He became <b>besotted</b> with a local barmaid</i> .
blind drunk	Unable or unwilling to perceive or understand.
blotto	Extremely drunk. <i>We got <b>blotto</b>.</i>
cockeyed	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>Cockeyed</i> camera angles.
crocked	Very drunk. He replaced the <b>crocked</b> captain early in the game.
drunken	Caused by or showing the effects of drink. His violent <b>drunken</b> father.
fuddled	Confused or stupefied, especially as a result of drinking alcohol. Benjamin was trying to clear his drink <b>fuddled</b> brain.
<u>incapable</u>	Not having the temperament or inclination for. Wilson blushed and was <b>incapable</b> of speech.
<u>inebriated</u>	Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol. <i>Helplessly inebriated</i> .
<u>intoxicated</u>	As if under the influence of alcohol. Felt <b>intoxicated</b> by her success.
loaded	(of a firearm) charged with ammunition. 1989 Ford 250 LXT low miles <b>loaded</b> .
maudlin	Self-pityingly or tearfully sentimental. Maudlin expressions of sympathy.
pie-eyed	Very drunk.
pixilated	Very drunk.
plastered	(of walls) covered with a coat of plaster. Coarsely <b>plastered</b> brickwork.
slopped	Very drunk.
sloshed	Drunk. I drank a lot of wine and got <b>sloshed</b> .
<u>soaked</u>	Extremely wet; saturated. A sun <b>soaked</b> beach.



sozzled	Very drunk. Uncle Brian s <b>sozzled</b> .
squiffy	Very drunk. The graphics make your eyes go <b>squiffy</b> .
<u>stiff</u>	(of a wind) blowing strongly. She greeted him with <b>stiff</b> politeness.
the worse for drink	Inferior to another in quality or condition or desirability.
tight	Of a community or other group of people having close relations tight knit. A <b>tight</b> parking spot.
<u>tipsy</u>	Unstable and prone to tip as if intoxicated. <b>Tipsy</b> revellers.
<b>under the influence</b> Lower in rank, power, or authority.	
<u>wet</u>	Very drunk. A <b>wet</b> canteen.





#### Usage Examples of "Smashed" as an adjective

- When they go back to the barracks, the single men get smashed.
- A smashed collar bone.



# Associations of "Smashed" (30 Words)

<u>annihilate</u>	Destroy utterly; obliterate. A fraction of the mass of atomic nuclei is <b>annihilate</b> d.
break	Breaking of hard tissue such as bone. This play will either make or <b>break</b> the playwright.
breaker	A person who breaks up disused machinery. <i>Those steam engines were now gone to the <b>breaker</b> s yard.</i>
<u>bust</u>	Separate or cause to separate abruptly. A 36 inch <b>bust</b> .



clash	A mismatch of colours. Two meteors <b>clash</b> ed.
<u>collapse</u>	Cause a lung or blood vessel to collapse. Some cots <b>collapse</b> down to fit into a holdall.
collide	Cause to collide. In his work politics and metaphysics <b>collide</b> .
<u>collision</u>	(physics) a brief event in which two or more bodies come together. A <b>collision</b> of two diverse cultures and languages.
crash	Enter a party without an invitation gatecrash. The terrorists <b>crash</b> ed the gate.
crush	Crush or bruise. The car <b>crush</b> ed the toy.
damage	Suffer or be susceptible to damage. Bombing caused extensive <b>damage</b> to the town.
<u>demolish</u>	Comprehensively refute (an argument or its proponent. Brown was busy <b>demolish</b> ing a sausage roll.
demolition	The act of demolishing. The <b>demolition</b> of the huge tower was quite a spectacle.
destroy	Destroy completely damage irreparably. The customs agents <b>destroy</b> ed the dog that was found to be rabid.
<u>destruction</u>	The action or process of killing or being killed. Gambling was his <b>destruction</b> .
devastate	Cause extensive destruction or ruin utterly. He was <b>devastate</b> d by his grief when his son died.
dilapidation	A cause of action to force a tenant to pay for dilapidations. <i>The mill was in a state of <b>dilapidation</b>.</i>
<u>dismantle</u>	Take (a machine or structure) to pieces. <i>The old regime was <b>dismantle</b>d.</i>
iconoclasm	The action of attacking or assertively rejecting cherished beliefs and institutions or established values and practices.
iconoclast	A supporter of the 8th- and 9th-century movement in the Byzantine Church which sought to abolish the veneration of icons and other religious images.
kaput	Destroyed or killed. The water pump s broken <b>kaput</b> .
mangle	Press with a mangle. Mangle the sheets.



moribund	Being on the point of death; breathing your last. A <b>moribund</b> patient.
pulverize	Destroy completely. The brick of the villages was <b>pulverize</b> d by the bombardment.
raze	Tear down so as to make flat with the ground. Villages were <b>raze</b> d to the ground.
removal	The act of removing. The <b>removal</b> of all legal barriers to the free movement of goods.
ruin	Destruction achieved by causing something to be wrecked or ruined. You have <b>ruin</b> ed my car by pouring sugar in the tank.
shatter	Damage or destroy. Everyone was <b>shatter</b> ed by the news.
shipwreck	Of a person or ship suffer a shipwreck. The angry waves whose fury heralds <b>shipwreck</b> .
subversion	The act of subverting; as overthrowing or destroying a legally constituted government. An 11 year sentence for inciting <b>subversion</b> .
	An 11 year semence for moning <b>subversion</b> .
