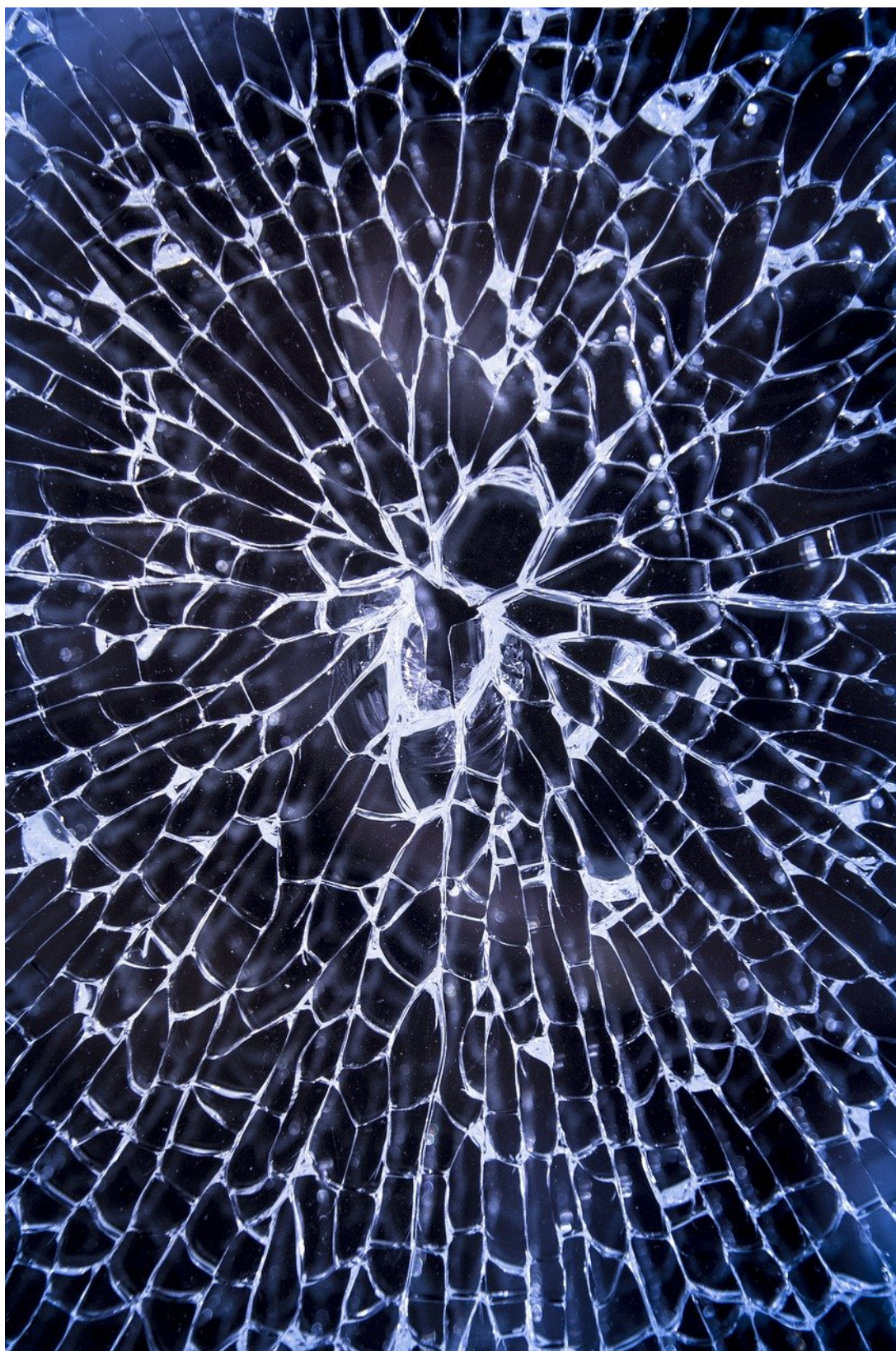

Synonyms of "Smashed" as an adjective (29 Words)

befuddled	Stupefied by alcoholic drink. <i>The wino s poor befuddled mind.</i>
<u>besotted</u>	Strongly infatuated. <i>He became besotted with a local barmaid.</i>
blind drunk	Unable or unwilling to perceive or understand.
blotto	Extremely drunk. <i>We got blotto.</i>
cockeyed	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>Cockeyed camera angles.</i>
crooked	Very drunk. <i>He replaced the crooked captain early in the game.</i>
drunken	Caused by or showing the effects of drink. <i>His violent drunken father.</i>
fuddled	Confused or stupefied, especially as a result of drinking alcohol. <i>Benjamin was trying to clear his drink fuddled brain.</i>
<u>incapable</u>	Not having the temperament or inclination for. <i>Wilson blushed and was incapable of speech.</i>
<u>inebriated</u>	Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol). <i>Helplessly inebriated.</i>
<u>intoxicated</u>	As if under the influence of alcohol. <i>Felt intoxicated by her success.</i>
loaded	(of a firearm) charged with ammunition. <i>1989 Ford 250 LXT low miles loaded.</i>
maudlin	Self-pityingly or tearfully sentimental. <i>Maudlin expressions of sympathy.</i>
pie-eyed	Very drunk.
pixilated	Very drunk.
plastered	(of walls) covered with a coat of plaster. <i>Coarsely plastered brickwork.</i>
slopped	Very drunk.
sloshed	Drunk. <i>I drank a lot of wine and got sloshed.</i>
<u>soaked</u>	Extremely wet; saturated. <i>A sun soaked beach.</i>

sozzled	Very drunk. <i>Uncle Brian s sozzled.</i>
squiffy	Very drunk. <i>The graphics make your eyes go squiffy.</i>
stiff	(of a wind) blowing strongly. <i>She greeted him with stiff politeness.</i>
the worse for drink	Inferior to another in quality or condition or desirability.
tight	Of a community or other group of people having close relations tight knit. <i>A tight parking spot.</i>
tipsy	Unstable and prone to tip as if intoxicated. <i>Tipsy revellers.</i>
under the influence	Lower in rank, power, or authority.
wet	Very drunk. <i>A wet canteen.</i>



Usage Examples of "Smashed" as an adjective

- *When they go back to the barracks, the single men get smashed.*
- *A smashed collar bone.*



Associations of "Smashed" (30 Words)

- annihilate** Destroy utterly; obliterate.
*A fraction of the mass of atomic nuclei is **annihilated**.*
- break** Breaking of hard tissue such as bone.
*This play will either make or **break** the playwright.*
- breaker** A person who breaks up disused machinery.
*Those steam engines were now gone to the **breaker** s yard.*
- bust** Separate or cause to separate abruptly.
*A 36 inch **bust**.*

clash	A mismatch of colours. <i>Two meteors clashed.</i>
<u>collapse</u>	Cause a lung or blood vessel to collapse. <i>Some cots collapse down to fit into a holdall.</i>
collide	Cause to collide. <i>In his work politics and metaphysics collide.</i>
<u>collision</u>	(physics) a brief event in which two or more bodies come together. <i>A collision of two diverse cultures and languages.</i>
crash	Enter a party without an invitation gatecrash. <i>The terrorists crashed the gate.</i>
crush	Crush or bruise. <i>The car crushed the toy.</i>
damage	Suffer or be susceptible to damage. <i>Bombing caused extensive damage to the town.</i>
<u>demolish</u>	Comprehensively refute (an argument or its proponent). <i>Brown was busy demolishing a sausage roll.</i>
demolition	The act of demolishing. <i>The demolition of the huge tower was quite a spectacle.</i>
destroy	Destroy completely damage irreparably. <i>The customs agents destroyed the dog that was found to be rabid.</i>
<u>destruction</u>	The action or process of killing or being killed. <i>Gambling was his destruction.</i>
devastate	Cause extensive destruction or ruin utterly. <i>He was devastated by his grief when his son died.</i>
dilapidation	A cause of action to force a tenant to pay for dilapidations. <i>The mill was in a state of dilapidation.</i>
<u>dismantle</u>	Take (a machine or structure) to pieces. <i>The old regime was dismantled.</i>
iconoclasm	The action of attacking or assertively rejecting cherished beliefs and institutions or established values and practices.
iconoclast	A supporter of the 8th- and 9th-century movement in the Byzantine Church which sought to abolish the veneration of icons and other religious images.
kaput	Destroyed or killed. <i>The water pump s broken kaput.</i>
mangle	Press with a mangle. <i>Mangle the sheets.</i>

moribund	Being on the point of death; breathing your last. <i>A moribund patient.</i>
pulverize	Destroy completely. <i>The brick of the villages was pulverized by the bombardment.</i>
raze	Tear down so as to make flat with the ground. <i>Villages were razed to the ground.</i>
removal	The act of removing. <i>The removal of all legal barriers to the free movement of goods.</i>
ruin	Destruction achieved by causing something to be wrecked or ruined. <i>You have ruined my car by pouring sugar in the tank.</i>
shatter	Damage or destroy. <i>Everyone was shattered by the news.</i>
shipwreck	Of a person or ship suffer a shipwreck. <i>The angry waves whose fury heralds shipwreck.</i>
<u>subversion</u>	The act of subverting; as overthrowing or destroying a legally constituted government. <i>An 11 year sentence for inciting subversion.</i>
