Luke darling she **simper**ed.

smile smugly Express with a smile.

Laugh in a half-suppressed, typically scornful way. snigger

Doesn t he look a fool they **snigger**ed.

A feeling of delight at being entertained.

She was like an adult planning **amusement**s for a child.

approvingly In an approving manner.

Several heads nodded **approvingly** at this concept.

**chortle** A noisy, gleeful laugh.

Thomas gave a chortle.

**chuckle** Laugh quietly or with restraint.

Melissa gave a **chuckle**.

cuddly Inviting cuddling or hugging.

A cuddly toy.

**derisive** Abusing vocally; expressing contempt or ridicule.

**Derisive** laughter.



An amusing person or thing; a joke. giggle

I got a fit of the **giggle**s.

Make happy; please. glad

**Glad** that they succeeded.

Express with a broad smile. grin

Dennis appeared **grin**ning cheerfully.

A loud and hearty laugh. guffaw

Both men **guffaw**ed at the remark.

Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. **hilarious** 

Hilarious broad comedy.

Great merriment. hilarity

By midnight the **hilarity** had increased.

A humorous anecdote or remark intended to provoke laughter. jape

The childish **jape** of depositing a stink bomb in her locker.

An object of derision.

jest You **jest** surely.

Characterized by jokes and good humor. jocular

She sounded in a **jocular** mood.

Full of or producing joy. <u>ioyful</u>

A joyful occasion.

A facial expression characteristic of a person laughing. laugh

She couldn t help **laugh**ing at his jokes.

The action or sound of laughing. laughter

He enjoyed the **laughter** of the crowd.

Great merriment. mirth

*His six foot frame shook with mirth.* 

Causing or showing a fondness for causing trouble in a playful way. **mischievous** 

Mischievous children.

An act of nodding the head.

nod The flowers were **nod**ding in the breeze.

An affectedly coy or ingratiating smile.

simper She **simper**ed looking pleased with herself.

Express with a smile. smile

She **smile**d her thanks.

Smiling; cheerful.

smiley He drew a **smiley** face.



smiling Smiling with happiness or optimism.

It s nice to see everyone s **smiling** faces.

snicker (of a horse) whinny.

The horse flicked its ears and **snicker**ed with pleasure.

Touch or stroke lightly.

He is **tickle**d by the idea.

titter Give a short, half-suppressed laugh; giggle.

There were **titter**s from the gallery.

uproarious Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter.

An **uproarious** party.

wink An act of winking.

The diamond on her finger **wink**ed in the moonlight.
