Definitions of "Smoky" as an adjective

- *Having the taste or aroma of smoked food.*
- *Producing or obscured by a great deal of smoke.*
- *Filled with or smelling of smoke.*
- *Tasting of smoke.*
- *Like smoke in colour or appearance.*



Synonyms of "Smoky" as an adjective (11 Words)

black	Relating to black people. <i>Black deeds.</i>
dark	Having a dark hue. <i>The dark days of the war.</i>
dark grey	Not giving performances; closed.
foggy	Unable to think clearly; confused. <i>She was foggy with sleep.</i>
grey	Of a person having grey hair. <i>The grey daily routine.</i>
hazy	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>It was a beautiful day but quite hazy.</i>
murky	Dark and gloomy, especially due to thick mist. <i>The murky silt of a muddy pond.</i>
smoggy	Clouded with a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>The smoggy atmosphere of Los Angeles.</i>
smoke-filled	Containing smoke.
sooty	Used in names of birds and other animals that are mainly blackish or brownish black e.g sooty tern. <i>His olive skin and sooty eyes.</i>
thick	Not thin of a specific thickness or of relatively great extent from one surface to the opposite usually in the smallest of the three solid dimensions. <i>Thick coating of dust.</i>
