Definitions of "Smorgasbord" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “smorgasbord” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A collection containing a variety of sorts of things.*
- *An assortment of foods starting with herring or smoked eel or salmon etc with bread and butter; then cheeses and eggs and pickled vegetables and aspics; finally hot foods; served as a buffet meal.*
- *A range of open sandwiches and delicacies served as hors d'oeuvres or a buffet.*
- *A wide range of something; a variety.*



Synonyms of "Smorgasbord" as a noun (21 Words)

assemblage	A system of components assembled together for a particular purpose. <i>A loose assemblage of diverse groups.</i>
assortment	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>The room was filled with an assortment of clothes.</i>
blend	The act of blending components together thoroughly. <i>Nearly all Scotch whiskies are blends.</i>
cold meal	The absence of heat.
cold table	A mild viral infection involving the nose and respiratory passages (but not the lungs).
collection	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>A preview of their autumn collection.</i>
medley	A varied mixture of people or things. <i>An interesting medley of flavours.</i>

melange	A motley assortment of things. <i>A melange of tender vegetables and herbs.</i>
miscellanea	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>Miscellanea derived from a job lot of anthropological monographs.</i>
miscellany	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A miscellany of houses.</i>
mix	A commercially prepared mixture of dry ingredients. <i>A group of young women groove in a circle to a DJ mix of Missy Elliot the Young Gunz and Kelis.</i>
<u>mixture</u>	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>He drank a mixture of beer and lemonade.</i>
motley	A garment made of motley especially a court jester s costume. <i>A motley of interacting interest groups.</i>
motley collection	A garment made of motley (especially a court jester’s costume.
pastiche	An artistic work in a style that imitates that of another work, artist, or period. <i>The songs amount to much more than blatant pastiche.</i>
patchwork	Sewing consisting of pieces of different materials sewn together in a pattern. <i>A piece of patchwork.</i>
potpourri	A musical composition consisting of a series of songs or other musical pieces from various sources. <i>He played a potpourri of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>
salmagundi	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>It is a salmagundi of styles.</i>
selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>Such men decided the selection of candidates.</i>
self-service	The practice of serving yourself (as in a grocery or cafeteria.
variety	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>A variety show.</i>
