gravy train	Public transport provided by a line of railway cars coupled together and drawn by a locomotive.

sinecure	A benefice to which no spiritual or pastoral duties are attached. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>
supper	A social gathering where a light evening meal is served. <i>We had a delicious cold supper.</i>
titbit	A small piece of tasty food. <i>They were hoping for titbits about the family.</i>
titbits	A small tasty bit of food.
treat	An act of treating someone to something. <i>My treat he insisted reaching for the bill.</i>
walkover	Any undertaking that is easy to do. <i>A 12 2 walkover.</i>

eat between meals Eat a meal; take a meal.

munch Chew noisily.
*Russell **munched** his breakfast toast.*

nibble Show cautious interest in a commercial opportunity.
*He **nibbled** a biscuit.*

nosh Eat food enthusiastically or greedily.
*There I sat **noshing** my favourite food.*

- *She never loses weight because she snacks between meals.*

appetizer	A small dish of food or a drink taken before a meal or the main course of a meal to stimulate one's appetite. <i>The afternoon games served as an appetizer for the evening s heavyweight clash between Borussia Dortmund and Bayern Munich.</i>
bread	Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking. <i>Bread the chicken and fry it in oil.</i>
breakfast	Eat breakfast. <i>We breakfast at seven.</i>
brunch	A late morning meal eaten instead of breakfast and lunch. <i>He cobbled together a brunch of cold remains from the fridge.</i>
cake	The amount of money or assets available to be divided up or shared. <i>A delicious cake smothered with whipped cream.</i>

cookery	The practice or skill of preparing and cooking food. <i>People are needed who have experience in cookery.</i>
cookie	A packet of data sent by a web server to a browser, which is returned by the browser each time it subsequently accesses the same server, used to identify the user or track their access to the server. <i>She s a tough cookie.</i>
crispy	(of food) having a firm, dry, and brittle surface or texture. <i>Crispy fried bacon.</i>
dessert	A dish served as the last course of a meal. <i>A dessert of chocolate mousse.</i>
dine	Take (someone) to dinner. <i>We dined at a restaurant.</i>
dinner	A party of people assembled to have dinner together. <i>Eric sits next to Beth at the dinner table.</i>
eat	Eat a meal take a meal. <i>She knew what was eating him.</i>
eating	The act of consuming food.
food	Anything that provides mental stimulus for thinking. <i>They had eaten their food and slept.</i>
fritter	Waste time, money, or energy on trifling matters. <i>I wish we hadn t frittered the money away so easily.</i>
lunch	Eat lunch. <i>He told his wife he was lunching with a client.</i>
luncheon	A formal lunch, or a formal word for lunch. <i>A ladies luncheon was taking place.</i>
meal	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening meal.</i>
mealtime	The hour at which a meal is habitually or customarily eaten. <i>Family life seemed to revolve around mealtimes.</i>
midday	The middle of the day; noon. <i>He awoke at midday.</i>
nibble	Bite gently. <i>The woman tenderly nibbled at her baby s ear.</i>
pancake	With reference to an aircraft make or cause to make a pancake landing. <i>Crispy pancakes filled with cheese.</i>
partake	Have, give, or receive a share of. <i>Visitors can partake in golfing or clay pigeon shooting.</i>

- postprandial** Occurring or done after a meal.
*An annual **postprandial** blood glucose test.*
- potluck** Whatever happens to be available especially when offered to an unexpected guest or when brought by guests and shared by all.
*A **potluck** supper.*
- recipe** A set of instructions for preparing a particular dish, including a list of the ingredients required.
*Sky high interest rates are a **recipe** for disaster.*
- refreshment** The giving of fresh strength or energy.
*Holidays are for **refreshment** and recreation.*
- sandwich** Relating to a sandwich course.
*She was **sandwiched** in her airplane seat between two fat men.*
- supper** A social gathering where a light evening meal is served.
*Her **suppers** often included celebrities.*
- vegetarian** Relating to vegetarians or vegetarianism.
*A **vegetarian** restaurant.*
