<b>child's play</b>	The time during which play proceeds.
<b>collation</b>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) a light meal allowed during a fast. <i>Data management and <b>collation</b>.</i>
<b>five-finger exercise</b>	The act of using.
<b>gift</b>	The act of giving. <i>That goal was an absolute <b>gift</b>.</i>
<b>gravy train</b>	Public transport provided by a line of railway cars coupled together and drawn by a locomotive.
<b>light meal</b>	A condition of spiritual awareness; divine illumination.
<b>nibbles</b>	Gentle biting.

<b>nothing</b>	A quantity of no importance. <i>It looked like <b>nothing</b> I had ever seen before.</i>
<b>refreshments</b>	Snacks and drinks served as a light meal. <i>Time for rest and refreshment by the pool.</i>
<b>sandwich</b>	Relating to a sandwich course. <i>A ham <b>sandwich</b>.</i>
<b>sinecure</b>	A benefice to which no spiritual or pastoral duties are attached. <i>Political <b>sinecures</b> for the supporters of ministers.</i>
<b>supper</b>	A social gathering where a light evening meal is served. <i>We had a delicious cold <b>supper</b>.</i>
<b>titbit</b>	A small piece of tasty food. <i>They were hoping for <b>titbits</b> about the family.</i>
<b>titbits</b>	A small tasty bit of food.
<b>treat</b>	An act of treating someone to something. <i>My <b>treat</b> he insisted reaching for the bill.</i>
<b>walkover</b>	Any undertaking that is easy to do. <i>A 12 2 <b>walkover</b>.</i>

- *It's clear from the pics that her new husband is a total snack.*

## Synonyms of "Snack" as a verb (4 Words)

**eat between meals** Eat a meal; take a meal.

**munch** Chew noisily.  
*Russell **munched** his breakfast toast.*

**nibble** Show cautious interest in a commercial opportunity.  
*He **nibbled** a biscuit.*

**nosh** Eat food enthusiastically or greedily.  
*There I sat **noshing** my favourite food.*

<b>appetizer</b>	A small dish of food or a drink taken before a meal or the main course of a meal to stimulate one's appetite. <i>The afternoon games served as an <b>appetizer</b> for the evening s heavyweight clash between Borussia Dortmund and Bayern Munich.</i>
<b>bread</b>	Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking. <i><b>Bread</b> the chicken and fry it in oil.</i>
<b>breakfast</b>	Eat breakfast. <i>We <b>breakfast</b> at seven.</i>
<b>brunch</b>	A late morning meal eaten instead of breakfast and lunch. <i>He cobbled together a <b>brunch</b> of cold remains from the fridge.</i>
<b>cake</b>	The amount of money or assets available to be divided up or shared. <i>A delicious <b>cake</b> smothered with whipped cream.</i>



<b>cookery</b>	The practice or skill of preparing and cooking food. <i>People are needed who have experience in <b>cookery</b>.</i>
<b>cookie</b>	A packet of data sent by a web server to a browser, which is returned by the browser each time it subsequently accesses the same server, used to identify the user or track their access to the server. <i>She s a tough <b>cookie</b>.</i>
<b>crispy</b>	(of food) having a firm, dry, and brittle surface or texture. <i><b>Crispy</b> fried bacon.</i>
<b>dessert</b>	A dish served as the last course of a meal. <i>A <b>dessert</b> of chocolate mousse.</i>
<b>dine</b>	Take (someone) to dinner. <i>We <b>dined</b> at a restaurant.</i>
<b>dinner</b>	A party of people assembled to have dinner together. <i>Eric sits next to Beth at the <b>dinner</b> table.</i>
<b>eat</b>	Eat a meal take a meal. <i>She knew what was <b>eating</b> him.</i>
<b>eating</b>	The act of consuming food.
<b>food</b>	Anything that provides mental stimulus for thinking. <i>They had eaten their <b>food</b> and slept.</i>
<b>fritter</b>	Waste time, money, or energy on trifling matters. <i>I wish we hadn t <b>frittered</b> the money away so easily.</i>
<b>lunch</b>	Eat lunch. <i>He told his wife he was <b>lunching</b> with a client.</i>
<b>luncheon</b>	A formal lunch, or a formal word for lunch. <i>A ladies <b>luncheon</b> was taking place.</i>
<b>meal</b>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening <b>meal</b>.</i>
<b>mealtime</b>	The hour at which a meal is habitually or customarily eaten. <i>Family life seemed to revolve around <b>mealtimes</b>.</i>
<b>midday</b>	The middle of the day; noon. <i>He awoke at <b>midday</b>.</i>
<b>nibble</b>	Bite gently. <i>The woman tenderly <b>nibbled</b> at her baby s ear.</i>
<b>pancake</b>	With reference to an aircraft make or cause to make a pancake landing. <i>Crispy <b>pancakes</b> filled with cheese.</i>
<b>partake</b>	Have, give, or receive a share of. <i>Visitors can <b>partake</b> in golfing or clay pigeon shooting.</i>

- postprandial** Occurring or done after a meal.  
*An annual **postprandial** blood glucose test.*
- potluck** Whatever happens to be available especially when offered to an unexpected guest or when brought by guests and shared by all.  
*A **potluck** supper.*
- recipe** A set of instructions for preparing a particular dish, including a list of the ingredients required.  
*Sky high interest rates are a **recipe** for disaster.*
- refreshment** The giving of fresh strength or energy.  
*Holidays are for **refreshment** and recreation.*
- sandwich** Relating to a sandwich course.  
*She was **sandwiched** in her airplane seat between two fat men.*
- supper** A social gathering where a light evening meal is served.  
*Her **suppers** often included celebrities.*
- vegetarian** Relating to vegetarians or vegetarianism.  
*A **vegetarian** restaurant.*
