supper	A social gathering where a light evening meal is served. <i>We had a delicious cold supper</i> .
titbit	A small piece of tasty food. They were hoping for titbit s about the family.
titbits	A small tasty bit of food.
treat	An act of treating someone to something. My treat he insisted reaching for the bill.
walkover	Any undertaking that is easy to do. A 12 2 walkover .

munch	Chew noisily. Russell munch ed his breakfast toast.
nibble	Show cautious interest in a commercial opportunity. <i>He</i> <i>nibble</i> <i>d a biscuit.</i>
nosh	Eat food enthusiastically or greedily. There I sat nosh ing my favourite food.

Associations of "Snack" (30 Words)

appetizer	A small dish of food or a drink taken before a meal or the main course of a meal to stimulate one's appetite. The afternoon games served as an appetizer for the evening s heavyweight clash between Borussia Dortmund and Bayern Munich.
bread	Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking. Bread the chicken and fry it in oil.
breakfast	Eat breakfast. We breakfast at seven.
brunch	A late morning meal eaten instead of breakfast and lunch. <i>He cobbled together a brunch of cold remains from the fridge.</i>
cake	The amount of money or assets available to be divided up or shared. A delicious cake smothered with whipped cream.



cookery	The practice or skill of preparing and cooking food. People are needed who have experience in cookery .
cookie	A packet of data sent by a web server to a browser, which is returned by the browser each time it subsequently accesses the same server, used to identify the user or track their access to the server. <i>She s a tough cookie</i> .
crispy	(of food) having a firm, dry, and brittle surface or texture. <i>Crispy fried bacon.</i>
<u>dessert</u>	A dish served as the last course of a meal. A dessert of chocolate mousse.
dine	Take (someone) to dinner. <i>We dined at a restaurant.</i>
<u>dinner</u>	A party of people assembled to have dinner together. <i>Eric sits next to Beth at the dinner table.</i>
eat	Eat a meal take a meal. She knew what was eat ing him.
eating	The act of consuming food.
food	Anything that provides mental stimulus for thinking. They had eaten their food and slept.
fritter	Waste time, money, or energy on trifling matters. I wish we hadn t fritter ed the money away so easily.
lunch	Eat lunch. He told his wife he was lunch ing with a client.
luncheon	A formal lunch, or a formal word for lunch. A ladies luncheon was taking place.
<u>meal</u>	The food eaten during a meal. The evening meal .
mealtime	The hour at which a meal is habitually or customarily eaten. Family life seemed to revolve around mealtime s.
midday	The middle of the day; noon. <i>He awoke at midday.</i>
nibble	Bite gently. The woman tenderly nibble d at her baby s ear.
pancake	With reference to an aircraft make or cause to make a pancake landing. Crispy pancake s filled with cheese.
<u>partake</u>	Have, give, or receive a share of. Visitors can partake in golfing or clay pigeon shooting.



postprandial	Occurring or done after a meal. An annual postprandial blood glucose test.
potluck	Whatever happens to be available especially when offered to an unexpected guest or when brought by guests and shared by all. <i>A potluck supper</i> .
<u>recipe</u>	A set of instructions for preparing a particular dish, including a list of the ingredients required. Sky high interest rates are a recipe for disaster.
refreshment	The giving of fresh strength or energy. Holidays are for refreshment and recreation.
sandwich	Relating to a sandwich course. She was sandwich ed in her airplane seat between two fat men.
supper	A social gathering where a light evening meal is served. <i>Her suppers often included celebrities.</i>
vegetarian	Relating to vegetarians or vegetarianism. A vegetarian restaurant.
