Snarky as an Adjective

Definitions of "Snarky" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “snarky” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Bad-tempered or irritable.*
- *Critical or mocking in an indirect or sarcastic way.*
- *Disdainfully or ironically humorous; scornful and mocking.*

Synonyms of "Snarky" as an adjective (7 Words)

acerbic	Harsh or corrosive in tone. <i>His acerbic wit.</i>
cutting	Capable of cutting something. <i>A cutting wind.</i>
sarcastic	Marked by or given to using irony in order to mock or convey contempt. <i>Making sarcastic comments.</i>
sardonic	Grimly mocking or cynical. <i>Starkey attempted a sardonic smile.</i>
satirical	Containing or using satire. <i>A persistent campaign of mockery by the satirical fortnightly magazine.</i>

scathing Marked by harshly abusive criticism.
His **scathing** remarks about silly lady novelists.

sharp Having or emitting a high pitched and sharp tone or tones.
The job was a **sharp** contrast from her past life.

Usage Examples of "Snarky" as an adjective

- Bobby's always a bit snarky before his nap.
- Snarky remarks.
