
Snob as a Noun

- A person with an exaggerated respect for high social position or wealth who seeks to associate with social superiors and looks down on those regarded as socially inferior.








Synonyms of "Snob" as a noun (3 Words)

snot Nasal mucus.








Usage Examples of "Snob" as a noun

Having or revealing an exaggerated sense of one's own importance or

<u>arrogant</u> abilities.

A typically **arrogant** assumption.

Making a strong, affected, or pretentious display of being artistic or

arty interested in the arts.

A very **arty** film.

A boastful or pompous person.

blowhard The segregationist **blowhard**s who would dominate the politics of my

state for a generation.

boastful Exhibiting self-importance.

A **boastful** letter.

brash Having an ostentatious or tasteless appearance.

He was **brash** cocky and arrogant.

cocksure Marked by excessive confidence.

An arrogant and **cocksure** materialist.

conceit The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride.

The idea of the wind s singing is a prime romantic **conceit**.

conceited Excessively proud of oneself; vain.

Fred s so **conceited** he d never believe anyone would refuse him.

(used of behavior or attitude) characteristic of those who treat others

condescending with condescension.

She thought the teachers were arrogant and condescending.

elitist Demonstrating a superior attitude or behaviour associated with an elite.

Critics portray him as an out of touch elitist.

Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one

haughty views as unworthy.

A haughty British aristocrat.

A highbrow person.

highbrow She considered all those without television as **highbrow**s intellectual

snobs or paupers.

immodest Lacking humility or decency.

TV shows full of **immodest** language.

Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one

imperious views as unworthy.

His **imperious** demands.



insolently In an insolent manner.

Appealing to or using the intellect.

intellectual **Intellectual** workers engaged in creative literary or artistic or scientific

labor.

Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one

lordly views as unworthy.

Lordly titles.

Pretentious or showy or vulgar display. ostentation

The office was spacious but without any trace of **ostentation**.

Expecting unquestioning obedience. **overbearing** An **overbearing** ill tempered brute.

Presumptuously arrogant. overweening

No idea how **overweening** he would be.

Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up

pomposity with vanity.

His reputation for arrogance and **pomposity**.

A person who behaves affectedly in order to impress others. poseur

A feeling of self-respect and personal worth. <u>pride</u>

He **pride**s himself on making it into law school.

Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. proud

A **proud** grandma of three boys.

Befitting or characteristic of those who incline to social exclusiveness

and who rebuff the advances of people considered inferior. snobbish

The writer takes a rather **snobbish** tone.

Expressive of contempt. supercilious

His mother eyed my clothes with a **supercilious** air.

The trait of displaying arrogance by patronizing those considered superciliousness

inferior.

Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. vainglorious

This **vainglorious** boast of personal infallibility.

The trait of being unduly vain and conceited; false pride. **vanity**
