apart	Remote and separate physically or socially- W.H.Hudson. <i>He leapt out of the car just before it was blown apart.</i>
consequently	(sentence connectors) because of the reason given. <i>Consequently he didn't do it.</i>
consistent	Sometimes followed by with in agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>The injuries are consistent with falling from a great height.</i>
consistently	In every case or on every occasion; invariably. <i>A team that consistently demonstrates a desire to win.</i>
continued	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>He asked for their continued support.</i>
detour	Avoid by taking a detour. <i>He had made a detour to a cafe.</i>
elongate	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The pup's globular body slowly elongates.</i>
elongated	Having notably more length than width; being long and slender. <i>The males are smaller and have more elongated bodies.</i>
endlessly	Without bounds. <i>The original episodes were endlessly repeated.</i>
enduring	Lasting over a period of time; durable. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i>
extend	Continue or extend. <i>He really extended himself when he climbed Kilimanjaro.</i>
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>Extended farm lands.</i>
extensible	Designed to allow the addition of new capabilities and functionality. <i>Silk is an exceptionally strong extensible and tough material.</i>

farther	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Farther north.</i>
indefinitely	To an unlimited or unspecified degree or extent. <i>Talks cannot go on indefinitely.</i>
infinitely	To a very great degree; immensely. <i>He is infinitely wealthy.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
length	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>A length of brown satin.</i>
lengthen	Make (a vowel or syllable) long. <i>In the spring when the days are lengthening.</i>
lengthy	(especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious. <i>A lengthy visit from her mother in law.</i>
outstretched	Fully extended especially in length. <i>She reached across and shook his outstretched hand.</i>
postpone	Cause or arrange for (something) to take place at a time later than that first scheduled. <i>The visit had to be postponed for some time.</i>
prolonged	Continuing for a long time or longer than usual; lengthy. <i>A prolonged and bitter struggle.</i>
protracted	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i>A protracted and bitter dispute.</i>
really	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>A really enjoyable evening.</i>
remarkably	To a remarkable degree or extent. <i>He seems remarkably relaxed about the whole thing.</i>
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Well stretched muscles are less susceptible to injury.</i>
therefore	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion therefore adv as a consequence. <i>Therefore X must be true.</i>
thus	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion thus adv in the way indicated thusly is a nonstandard variant. <i>Set up the pieces thus.</i>
