<b>abundance</b>	(chemistry) the ratio of the total mass of an element in the earth's crust to the total mass of the earth's crust; expressed as a percentage or in parts per million. <i>She was blessed with talent and charm in <b>abundance</b>.</i>
<b>appreciably</b>	To an appreciable extent; considerably. <i>An <b>appreciably</b> higher risk.</i>
<b>badly</b>	With great intensity bad is a nonstandard variant for badly. <i>Thought <b>badly</b> of him for his lack of concern.</i>
<b>considerably</b>	To a great extent or degree. <i>Things have improved <b>considerably</b> over the last few years.</i>
<b><u>countless</u></b>	Too many to be counted; very many. <i><b>Countless</b> hours.</i>
<b><u>enormously</u></b>	Extremely. <i>He was <b>enormously</b> popular.</i>
<b>galore</b>	In abundance. <i>There were prizes <b>galore</b> for everything.</i>
<b>greatly</b>	By a considerable amount; very much. <i>They now have <b>greatly</b> increased powers.</i>
<b><u>hence</u></b>	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion hence adv from this place. <i>Get thee <b>hence</b>.</i>
<b><u>highly</u></b>	In a high position or level or rank. <i>His colleagues think very <b>highly</b> of him.</i>
<b>immensely</b>	To a great extent; extremely. <i>Was <b>immensely</b> more important to the project as a scientist than as an administrator.</i>
<b>incalculable</b>	(of a person or their character) unpredictable. <i><b>Incalculable</b> riches.</i>

<b>innumerable</b>	Too numerous to be counted. <i>Innumerable flags of all colours.</i>
<b>lot</b>	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>Eventually the <b>lot</b> fell on the King's daughter.</i>
<b>many</b>	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by 'as' or 'too' or 'so' or 'that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. <i>The temptations are <b>many</b>.</i>
<b>more</b>	Moreover. <i>We have no <b>more</b> bananas.</i>
<b>multiplicity</b>	The property of being multiple. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a <b>multiplicity</b> of factors.</i>
<b>myriad</b>	The cardinal number that is the product of ten and one thousand. <i><b>Myriads</b> of insects danced around the light above my head.</i>
<b>numberless</b>	Too numerous to be counted. <i>There are <b>numberless</b> questions to be asked.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Consisting of many members. <i>She had complained to the council on <b>numerous</b> occasions.</i>
<b>outnumber</b>	Be larger in number. <i>Women <b>outnumbered</b> men by three to one.</i>
<b>overly</b>	To a degree exceeding normal or proper limits. <i>She was a jealous and <b>overly</b> possessive woman.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Producing in abundance. <i>A <b>plentiful</b> year.</i>
<b>plenty</b>	A full supply. <i>She has <b>plenty</b> more ideas.</i>
<b>really</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>They're not <b>really</b> my aunt and uncle.</i>
<b>substantially</b>	In a strong substantial way. <i>The price went up <b>substantially</b>.</i>
<b>therefore</b>	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion therefore adv as a consequence. <i>He was injured and <b>therefore</b> unable to play.</i>
<b>thus</b>	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion thus adv in the way indicated thusly is a nonstandard variant. <i>She rang up Susan and while she was <b>thus</b> engaged Chignell summoned the doctor.</i>

In accordance with truth or fact or reality.

**very**

Actual; precise (used to emphasize the exact identity of someone or something).

*He played **very** well.*
