actually	Used when expressing a contradictory or unexpected opinion or correcting someone. <i>She actually spoke Latin.</i>
aforementioned	Denoting a thing or person previously mentioned. <i>Works of all the aforementioned authors.</i>
aforesaid	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of.
candidly	In an honest and straightforward way; frankly. <i>He candidly discussed his efforts to find employment.</i>
certify	Declare legally insane. <i>The Law Society will certify that the sum charged is fair and reasonable.</i>
chat	Birds having a chattering call. <i>He dropped in for a chat.</i>
chatter	Make noise as if chattering away. <i>The starlings constant chatter.</i>
dah	The longer of the two telegraphic signals used in Morse code.
describe	Mark out or draw (a geometrical figure). <i>The man was described as tall clean shaven and with short dark hair.</i>
dialog	A conversation between two persons.
dialogue	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>The USA would enter into a direct dialogue with Vietnam.</i>
explain	Give a reason so as to justify or excuse (an action or event). <i>He explained the laws of physics to his students.</i>
gibberish	Unintelligible talking. <i>He talks gibberish.</i>
hereby	By means of this. <i>I hereby declare you man and wife.</i>

<u>honestly</u>	It is sincerely the case that used as intensives reflecting the speaker's attitude honestly adv in an honest manner. <i>She honestly believed that she was making life easier for Jack.</i>
literally	Used for emphasis while not being literally true. <i>Tiramisu literally translated pull me up.</i>
mention	An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. <i>I haven't mentioned it to William yet.</i>
<u>narrative</u>	The practice or art of telling stories. <i>Traditions of oral narrative.</i>
palaver	Have a lengthy discussion, usually between people of different backgrounds. <i>It's too hot for palavering.</i>
prate	Idle or foolish and irrelevant talk. <i>I heard him prate on for at least an hour and a half.</i>
recitative	Musical declamation of the kind usual in the narrative and dialogue parts of opera and oratorio, sung in the rhythm of ordinary speech with many words on the same note. <i>Singing in recitative.</i>
speech	(language) communication by word of mouth. <i>The actor forgot his speech.</i>
<u>spoken</u>	Speaking in a specified way. <i>Sharp spoken.</i>
talk	The act of giving a talk to an audience. <i>A talk on a day in the life of an actor.</i>
talking	The action of talking speech or discussion. <i>I'll do the talking you just back me up.</i>
therefore	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion therefore adv as a consequence. <i>He was injured and therefore unable to play.</i>
<u>thus</u>	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion thus adv in the way indicated thusly is a nonstandard variant. <i>She rang up Susan and while she was thus engaged Chignell summoned the doctor.</i>
<u>truly</u>	By right. <i>He speaks truly.</i>
verbosity	The fact or quality of using more words than needed; wordiness. <i>A critic with a reputation for verbosity.</i>
