loquacious	Tending to talk a great deal; talkative. <i>Never loquacious Sarah was now totally lost for words.</i>
maunder	Move or act in a dreamy or idle manner. <i>He maunders through the bank composing his thoughts.</i>
narrative	A spoken or written account of connected events; a story. <i>The coalition s carefully constructed narrative about its sensitivity to recession victims.</i>
palaver	Lengthy and unproductive discussion. <i>He palavered her into going along.</i>
really	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>A really enjoyable evening.</i>
