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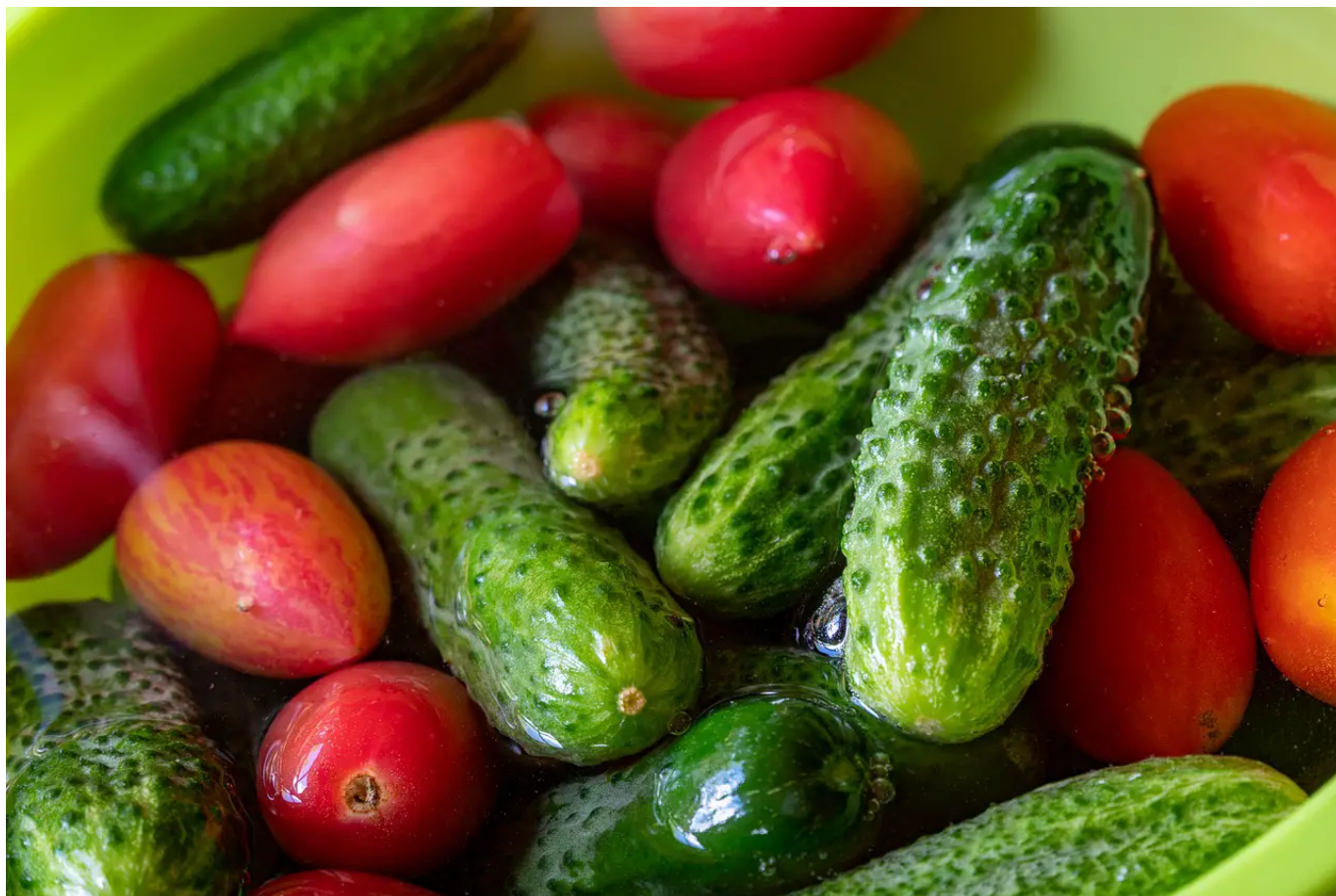

Synonyms of "Soaked" as an adjective (28 Words)

besotted	Strongly infatuated. <i>He became besotted with a local barmaid.</i>
blind drunk	Unable or unwilling to perceive or understand.
blotto	Very drunk. <i>We got blotto.</i>
cockeyed	Absurd; impractical. <i>I got cockeyed.</i>
crocked	Very drunk. <i>His party guests were pretty crocked.</i>
disarranged	Having the arrangement disturbed; not in order. <i>Her disarranged hair.</i>
dishevelled	(of a person's hair, clothes, or appearance) untidy; disordered. <i>A man with long dishevelled hair.</i>

disordered	Thrown into a state of disarray or confusion. <i>A patient who is mentally disordered.</i>
fuddled	Very drunk. <i>Fuddled drinkers spilt their brandy and slid beneath the table.</i>
in a mess	Holding office.
loaded	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. <i>A loaded question.</i>
<u>messy</u>	Generating or involving mess. <i>A child s messy eating habits.</i>
pie-eyed	Very drunk.
pixilated	Drunk.
plastered	Very drunk. <i>Black hair plastered with pomade.</i>
slopped	Very drunk.
sloshed	Drunk. <i>I drank a lot of wine and got sloshed.</i>
<u>smashed</u>	Very drunk. <i>A smashed collar bone.</i>
sozzled	Very drunk. <i>A permanently sozzled woman.</i>
squiffy	Askew; awry. <i>I feel quite squiffy.</i>
<u>stiff</u>	Requiring strength or effort; difficult. <i>A stiff current.</i>
tight	Pulled or drawn tight. <i>A tight fitting top.</i>
tousled	In disarray; extremely disorderly- Al Spiers. <i>She wore her hair in tousled curls.</i>
unkempt	Not properly maintained or cared for. <i>Wild unkempt hair.</i>
untidy	Not inclined to keep one's possessions or appearance neat and in order. <i>The place was dreadfully untidy.</i>
<u>wet</u>	(of a person) addicted to or drinking alcohol. <i>The waterproofer can easily be washed off while it is still wet.</i>

- *He got absolutely soaked in the rain.*

addicted	Enthusiastically devoted to a particular thing or activity. <i>She became addicted to alcohol and diet pills.</i>
addictive	Causing or characterized by addiction. <i>Addictive drugs.</i>
alcoholic	Characteristic of or containing alcohol. <i>Alcoholic expatriates in Paris.</i>
<u>beer</u>	A general name for alcoholic beverages made by fermenting a cereal (or mixture of cereals) flavored with hops. <i>A beer bottle.</i>
carousal	Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.
carouse	Engage in boisterous, drunken merrymaking. <i>They danced and caroused until the drink ran out.</i>

damp	Damp air or atmosphere. <i>She tried to damp down her feelings of despair.</i>
dampness	The state or condition of being slightly wet. <i>The dampness in the air.</i>
dank	Unpleasantly cool and humid. <i>Huge dank caverns.</i>
distiller	A person or company that manufactures spirits. <i>A family owned whisky distiller.</i>
drenched	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. <i>Moon drenched meadows.</i>
drinker	A person who drinks liquids. <i>A heavy drinker.</i>
intoxicant	Causing. <i>Intoxicants and drugs are used by some to escape physical or psychological pain.</i>
kleptomaniac	Someone with an irrational urge to steal in the absence of an economic motive.
liquor	The liquid in which vegetables or meat have be cooked. <i>Waste liquors.</i>
marshland	Land consisting of marshes. <i>Acres of meadows and marshlands.</i>
moist	Slightly wet. <i>Her brother s eyes became moist.</i>
moisture	Wetness caused by water. <i>The air was constantly heavy with moisture.</i>
plastered	Made smooth by applying a sticky or glossy substance. <i>Coarsely plastered brickwork.</i>
rain	Rain falls. <i>If it rains much more we can expect some flooding.</i>
saturated	Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats. <i>A mass of saturated air decreases in temperature as it rises in the atmosphere.</i>
sober	Become sober after excessive alcohol consumption. <i>His expression sobered her.</i>

sobriety	Abstaining from excess. <i>She speaks with such sobriety it's clear she speaks the truth.</i>
sodden	Having drunk an excessive amount of a particular alcoholic drink. <i>The speaker's sodden collar.</i>
tropics	The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
vapor	The process of becoming a vapor.
<u>wet</u>	Wetness caused by water. Wet sidewalks.
