- gliding** The activity of flying a glider.
- sailing** The action of sailing in a ship or boat.
*On the eve of her **sailing** she learned that news had come in from Cyprus.*
- sailplaning** The activity of flying a glider.



Soaring as an Adjective

Definitions of "Soaring" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "soaring" as an adjective can have the

following definitions:

- *Of imposing height; especially standing out above others.*
- *(of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings.*
- *Ascending to a level markedly higher than the usual.*
- *Flying or rising high in the air.*
- *Increasing rapidly above the usual level.*



Synonyms of "Soaring" as an adjective (3 Words)

eminent (of a person) famous and respected within a particular sphere.
***Eminent** members of the community.*

lofty Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks.
*A noble and **lofty** concept.*

towering Of imposing height; especially standing out above others.
*Hari looked up at the **towering** buildings.*

- *You may spy bighorn sheep and soaring eagles.*
- *The coloured trails of soaring rockets.*
- *The soaring spires of the cathedral.*
- *Soaring prices.*



Associations of "Soaring" (30 Words)

altitude	The length of the perpendicular line from a vertex to the opposite side of a figure. <i>The altitude gave her a headache.</i>
ascent	The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>The ascent grew steeper.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	Raise the axis of (a piece of artillery) to increase its range. <i>He was elevated to Secretary of State.</i>
elevated	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style. <i>An elevated platform.</i>
<u>elevation</u>	A particular side of a building. <i>An elevation of the temperature in the afternoon.</i>
gangling	(of a person) tall, thin, and awkward in movements or bearing. <i>A gangling youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.</i>

gangly	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.
grow	Become attached by or as if by the process of growth. <i>Morels grow in a variety of places.</i>
height	A high place or position. <i>He was of medium height.</i>
high	At a high price. <i>The high point of his career.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>The first time I put them on one of the stockings laddered.</i>
lanky	Tall and thin. <i>A lanky kid transformed almost overnight into a handsome young man.</i>
lofty	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>Lofty ships.</i>
minaret	A slender tower, typically part of a mosque, with a balcony from which a muezzin calls Muslims to prayer.
peak	To reach the highest point; attain maximum intensity, activity. <i>Package holiday sales hit a peak of around 12 million.</i>
pinnacle	Raise on or as if on a pinnacle. <i>He had reached the pinnacle of his career.</i>
plateau	An area of fairly level high ground. <i>The peace process had reached a plateau.</i>
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i>The lord and his family ate on a raised platform at one end of the hall.</i>
rise	Rise to one s feet. <i>The activists urged militant factions to rise up.</i>
skyscraper	A very tall building with many stories.
spire	A tapering conical or pyramidal structure on the top of a building, typically a church tower. <i>Spires of delphiniums.</i>
statuesque	(of a woman) attractively tall, graceful, and dignified. <i>Her statuesque beauty.</i>
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
stilted	Standing on stilts. <i>A stilted letter of acknowledgment.</i>
summit	Reach the summit of a mountain. <i>Two binding treaties were agreed at the summit.</i>

- tall** A garment size for a tall person.
*A **tall** order.*
- towering** Extremely tall, especially in comparison with the surroundings.
*Hari looked up at the **towering** buildings.*
- up** Used as a command to a soldier or an animal to stand up and be ready to move or attack.
*He lay face **up**.*
- willowy** Bordered, shaded, or covered by willows.
*A beautiful **willowy** blonde.*
- zoom** Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out.
*The share index **zoomed** by about 136 points.*
