According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "soaring" as an adjective can have the



following definitions:

- Of imposing height; especially standing out above others.
- (of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings.
- Ascending to a level markedly higher than the usual.
- Flying or rising high in the air.
- Increasing rapidly above the usual level.
