## Definitions of "Soaring" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "soaring" as an adjective can have the



following definitions:

- Of imposing height; especially standing out above others.
- (of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings.
- Ascending to a level markedly higher than the usual.
- Flying or rising high in the air.
- Increasing rapidly above the usual level.

eminent (of a person) famous and respected within a particular sphere.
*Eminent* members of the community.
Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks.
*towering* Of imposing height; especially standing out above others.

The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>The <b>ascent</b> grew steeper</i> .
Raise the axis of (a piece of artillery) to increase its range. <i>He was <b>elevate</b>d to Secretary of State.</i>
Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style. An <b>elevated</b> platform.
A particular side of a building. An <b>elevation</b> of the temperature in the afternoon.
(of a person) tall, thin, and awkward in movements or bearing. A <b>gangling</b> youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.



gangly	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.
grow	Become attached by or as if by the process of growth. Morels <b>grow</b> in a variety of places.
<u>height</u>	A high place or position. <i>He was of medium <b>height</b></i> .
high	At a high price. The <b>high</b> point of his career.
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. The first time I put them on one of the stockings <b>ladder</b> ed.
lanky	Tall and thin. A <b>lanky</b> kid transformed almost overnight into a handsome young man.
<u>lofty</u>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>Lofty ships</i> .
minaret	A slender tower, typically part of a mosque, with a balcony from which a muezzin calls Muslims to prayer.
<u>peak</u>	To reach the highest point; attain maximum intensity, activity. Package holiday sales hit a <b>peak</b> of around 12 million.
<u>pinnacle</u>	Raise on or as if on a pinnacle. <i>He had reached the <b>pinnacle</b> of his career.</i>
<u>plateau</u>	An area of fairly level high ground. The peace process had reached a <b>plateau</b> .
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. The lord and his family ate on a <b>raised</b> platform at one end of the hall.
rise	Rise to one s feet. <i>The activists urged militant factions to</i> <b>rise</b> up.
skyscraper	A very tall building with many stories.
<u>spire</u>	A tapering conical or pyramidal structure on the top of a building, typically a church tower. <i>Spires of delphiniums.</i>
statuesque	(of a woman) attractively tall, graceful, and dignified. <i>Her <b>statuesque</b> beauty.</i>
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
stilted	Standing on stilts. A <b>stilted</b> letter of acknowledgment.
<u>summit</u>	Reach the summit of a mountain. Two binding treaties were agreed at the <b>summit</b> .



tall	A garment size for a tall person. A <b>tall</b> order.
towering	Extremely tall, especially in comparison with the surroundings. Hari looked up at the <b>towering</b> buildings.
<u>up</u>	Used as a command to a soldier or an animal to stand up and be ready to move or attack. <i>He lay face up</i> .
willowy	Bordered, shaded, or covered by willows. A beautiful <b>willowy</b> blonde.
<u>zoom</u>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. The share index <b>zoom</b> ed by about 136 points.
