- (of a place, occasion, or activity) characterized by friendliness or social interaction.

**gregarious**Growing in groups that are close together.


*In the wild trees are usually gregarious plants.*

**extrovert** Relating to denoting or typical of an extrovert.

extroverted Not introspective; examining what is outside yourself.

*She* is **extroverted** confident and gives rousing lectures.

friendly Not seriously or unpleasantly competitive or divisive.

She gave me a **friendly** smile.

Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw.

A **genial** host.

gregarious (of animals) living in flocks or loosely organized communities.

He is a **gregarious** person who avoids solitude.

hearty (of a person) strong and healthy.

A hearty and boisterous character.

Please (used in a polite request or demand, often ironically.

nice Done with delicacy and skill.

**obliging** Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others.

One of the most **obliging** stewards.

outgoing A person's regular expenditure.

The inward deliveries and **outgoing**s of raw materials.

personality Lively, engaging qualities.

She's always had loads of **personality**.

pleasant (of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable.

talkative Unwisely talking too much.
