<u>academy</u>	(in England) an inner-city school which is funded by the government and sometimes also by a private individual or organization but is not controlled by the local authority. <i>A police academy</i> .
alumnus	A former member of a group, company, or organization. A Harvard alumnus .
<u>befriend</u>	Act as or become a friend to (someone), especially when they are in need of help or support. <i>He makes a point of befriending newcomers to Parliament.</i>
<u>bourgeois</u>	A bourgeois person. A self confessed and proud bourgeois .
<u>campus</u>	The grounds and buildings of a university or college. For the first year I had a room on campus .
<u>club</u>	Strike with a club or a bludgeon. He felt as if he had been hit with a club .
college	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>The Oxford colleges.</i>
collegian	A member of a college, especially within a university.
cultural	Of or relating to the shared knowledge and values of a society. Influenced by ethnic and cultural ties.
education	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. A girl s education was less important than a boy s.
grad	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university.



<u>graduate</u>	A graduated cup tube flask or measuring glass used especially by chemists and pharmacists. <i>Graduate</i> a cylinder.
graduated	Arranged in a series or according to a scale. A graduated tax.
graduation	A mark on a container or instrument indicating a degree of quantity. <i>The ruler had 16 graduations per inch.</i>
institution	An organization founded and united for a specific purpose. About 5 per cent of elderly people live in institution s.
intelligentsia	Intellectuals or highly educated people as a group, especially when regarded as possessing culture and political influence. <i>A distrust of the intelligentsia and of theoretical learning.</i>
lecturer	A public lecturer at certain universities. A senior lecturer in surgery at Leeds University.
literati	The literary intelligentsia.
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. The arms have been matriculate d by the Lord Lyon King of Arms in Edinburgh.
philistine	Of or relating to ancient Philistia or its culture or its people. There were displays to inspire even the most philistine of visitors.
polytechnic	A technical school offering instruction in many industrial arts and applied sciences.
postgraduate	A student engaged in a postgraduate course. A postgraduate degree.
pupil	A trainee barrister. Will you take me on as your pupil .
regimentation	The imposition of order or discipline.
theorist	A person concerned with the theoretical aspects of a subject; a theoretician.
timetable	A chart showing how the weekly time of a school or college is allotted to classes. These itineraries are subject to bus timetable s.
<u>trainee</u>	Someone who is being trained. <i>Trainee</i> solicitors.
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. An undergraduate degree.



university The body of faculty and students at a university. *His daughter is at university.*

valedictorian The student with the best grades who usually delivers the valedictory address at commencement.
