## Associations of "Social class" (30 Words)

<a href="#">academy</a>	(in England) an inner-city school which is funded by the government and sometimes also by a private individual or organization but is not controlled by the local authority. <i>A police <b>academy</b>.</i>
<b>alumnus</b>	A former member of a group, company, or organization. <i>A Harvard <b>alumnus</b>.</i>
<a href="#">befriend</a>	Act as or become a friend to (someone), especially when they are in need of help or support. <i>He makes a point of <b>befriending</b> newcomers to Parliament.</i>
<a href="#">bourgeois</a>	A bourgeois person. <i>A self confessed and proud <b>bourgeois</b>.</i>
<a href="#">campus</a>	The grounds and buildings of a university or college. <i>For the first year I had a room on <b>campus</b>.</i>
<a href="#">club</a>	Strike with a club or a bludgeon. <i>He felt as if he had been hit with a <b>club</b>.</i>
<b>college</b>	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>The Oxford <b>colleges</b>.</i>
<b>collegian</b>	A member of a college, especially within a university.
<b>cultural</b>	Of or relating to the shared knowledge and values of a society. <i>Influenced by ethnic and <b>cultural</b> ties.</i>
<b>education</b>	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>A girl s <b>education</b> was less important than a boy s.</i>
<b>grad</b>	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).

<b>graduate</b>	A graduated cup tube flask or measuring glass used especially by chemists and pharmacists. <b>Graduate</b> a cylinder.
<b>graduated</b>	Arranged in a series or according to a scale. A <b>graduated</b> tax.
<b>graduation</b>	A mark on a container or instrument indicating a degree of quantity. The ruler had 16 <b>graduations</b> per inch.
<b>institution</b>	An organization founded and united for a specific purpose. About 5 per cent of elderly people live in <b>institutions</b> .
<b>intelligentsia</b>	Intellectuals or highly educated people as a group, especially when regarded as possessing culture and political influence. A distrust of the <b>intelligentsia</b> and of theoretical learning.
<b>lecturer</b>	A public lecturer at certain universities. A senior <b>lecturer</b> in surgery at Leeds University.
<b>literati</b>	The literary intelligentsia.
<b>matriculate</b>	A person who has matriculated. The arms have been <b>matriculated</b> by the Lord Lyon King of Arms in Edinburgh.
<b>philistine</b>	Of or relating to ancient Philistia or its culture or its people. There were displays to inspire even the most <b>philistine</b> of visitors.
<b>polytechnic</b>	A technical school offering instruction in many industrial arts and applied sciences.
<b>postgraduate</b>	A student engaged in a postgraduate course. A <b>postgraduate</b> degree.
<b>pupil</b>	A trainee barrister. Will you take me on as your <b>pupil</b> .
<b>regimentation</b>	The imposition of order or discipline.
<b>theorist</b>	A person concerned with the theoretical aspects of a subject; a theoretician.
<b>timetable</b>	A chart showing how the weekly time of a school or college is allotted to classes. These itineraries are subject to bus <b>timetables</b> .
<b>trainee</b>	Someone who is being trained. <b>Trainee</b> solicitors.
<b>undergraduate</b>	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. An <b>undergraduate</b> degree.
