| advocacy | The profession or work of a legal advocate. <i>Solicitors should have a record of advocacy in the lower courts.</i> |
| communism | A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society. |
| companionable | Suggestive of companionship. <i>They walked in companionable silence.</i> |
| conformism | Orthodoxy in thoughts and belief. |
| conservatism | A political or theological orientation advocating the preservation of the best in society and opposing radical changes. <i>A party that espoused conservatism.</i> |
| conservative | (of surgery or medical treatment) intended to control rather than eliminate a condition, with existing tissue preserved as far as possible. <i>He was considered a conservative in his approach to Catholic teachings.</i> |
| cultural | Relating to the raising of plants or animals. <i>A cultural festival.</i> |
| custom | Regular dealings with a shop or business by customers. <i>I have given this tailor my custom for many years.</i> |
| decorum | Suitability to the requirements of a person, rank, or occasion. <i>He had no idea of funeral decorum.</i> |
| demagogue | A political leader who seeks support by appealing to popular passions and prejudices. <i>The Athenian demagogues had definite and valuable functions within the state.</i> |
| democracy | A state governed under a system of democracy. <i>The intended extension of industrial democracy.</i> |
| democrat | An advocate of democratic principles. <i>As a democrat I accepted the outcome of the referendum.</i> |

| democratic | (in the US) relating to the Democratic Party. <i>A democratic or popular movement.</i> |
| etiquette | Rules governing socially acceptable behavior. <i>The rules of etiquette are changing.</i> |
| fascism | A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health fascism in action.</i> |
| governmental | Relating to or dealing with the affairs or structure of government or politics or the state. <i>Public confidence and governmental morale.</i> |
| gregarious | (of a person) fond of company; sociable. <i>He was a popular and gregarious man.</i> |
| institution | An established official organization having an important role in a society, such as the Church or parliament. <i>He had become an institution in the theater.</i> |
| liberalism | The holding of political views that are socially progressive and promote social welfare. <i>One of the basic tenets of liberalism is tolerance.</i> |
| milieu | The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic milieu as Sidonius.</i> |
| mores | The essential or characteristic customs and conventions of a society or community. <i>An offence against social mores.</i> |
| political | Relating to the ideas or strategies of a particular party or group in politics. <i>Calling a meeting is a political act in itself.</i> |
| privatize | Change from governmental to private control or ownership. <i>The oil industry was privatized.</i> |
| regimentation | The imposition of order or discipline. |
| revolutionary | A radical supporter of political or social revolution. <i>A revolutionary new drug.</i> |
| sociable | An open carriage with facing side seats. <i>A sociable conversation.</i> |
| socialism | Policy or practice based on the political and economic theory of socialism. |
| surroundings | The area in which something exists or lives. <i>I took up the time admiring my surroundings.</i> |

theorist A person concerned with the theoretical aspects of a subject; a theoretician.

totalitarianism The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government.
*Democratic countries were fighting against **totalitarianism**.*
