## Associations of "Social media s" (30 Words)

<b>advocacy</b>	The profession or work of a legal advocate. <i>Solicitors should have a record of <b>advocacy</b> in the lower courts.</i>
<b>communism</b>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<b>companionable</b>	Suggestive of companionship. <i>They walked in <b>companionable</b> silence.</i>
<b>conformism</b>	Orthodoxy in thoughts and belief.
<b>conservatism</b>	A political or theological orientation advocating the preservation of the best in society and opposing radical changes. <i>A party that espoused <b>conservatism</b>.</i>
<b>conservative</b>	(of surgery or medical treatment) intended to control rather than eliminate a condition, with existing tissue preserved as far as possible. <i>He was considered a <b>conservative</b> in his approach to Catholic teachings.</i>
<b>cultural</b>	Relating to the raising of plants or animals. <i>A <b>cultural</b> festival.</i>
<b>custom</b>	Regular dealings with a shop or business by customers. <i>I have given this tailor my <b>custom</b> for many years.</i>
<b>decorum</b>	Suitability to the requirements of a person, rank, or occasion. <i>He had no idea of funeral <b>decorum</b>.</i>
<b>demagogue</b>	A political leader who seeks support by appealing to popular passions and prejudices. <i>The Athenian <b>demagogues</b> had definite and valuable functions within the state.</i>
<b>democracy</b>	A state governed under a system of democracy. <i>The intended extension of industrial <b>democracy</b>.</i>
<b>democrat</b>	An advocate of democratic principles. <i>As a <b>democrat</b> I accepted the outcome of the referendum.</i>

<b>democratic</b>	(in the US) relating to the Democratic Party. <i>A <b>democratic</b> or popular movement.</i>
<b>etiquette</b>	Rules governing socially acceptable behavior. <i>The rules of <b>etiquette</b> are changing.</i>
<b>fascism</b>	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health <b>fascism</b> in action.</i>
<b>governmental</b>	Relating to or dealing with the affairs or structure of government or politics or the state. <i>Public confidence and <b>governmental</b> morale.</i>
<b>gregarious</b>	(of a person) fond of company; sociable. <i>He was a popular and <b>gregarious</b> man.</i>
<b>institution</b>	An established official organization having an important role in a society, such as the Church or parliament. <i>He had become an <b>institution</b> in the theater.</i>
<b>liberalism</b>	The holding of political views that are socially progressive and promote social welfare. <i>One of the basic tenets of <b>liberalism</b> is tolerance.</i>
<b>milieu</b>	The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic <b>milieu</b> as Sidonius.</i>
<b>mores</b>	The essential or characteristic customs and conventions of a society or community. <i>An offence against social <b>mores</b>.</i>
<b>political</b>	Relating to the ideas or strategies of a particular party or group in politics. <i>Calling a meeting is a <b>political</b> act in itself.</i>
<b>privatize</b>	Change from governmental to private control or ownership. <i>The oil industry was <b>privatized</b>.</i>
<b>regimentation</b>	The imposition of order or discipline.
<b>revolutionary</b>	A radical supporter of political or social revolution. <i>A <b>revolutionary</b> new drug.</i>
<b>sociable</b>	An open carriage with facing side seats. <i>A <b>sociable</b> conversation.</i>
<b>socialism</b>	Policy or practice based on the political and economic theory of socialism.
<b>surroundings</b>	The area in which something exists or lives. <i>I took up the time admiring my <b>surroundings</b>.</i>

- theorist** A person concerned with the theoretical aspects of a subject; a theoretician.
- totalitarianism** The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government.  
*Democratic countries were fighting against **totalitarianism**.*
